BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> Amends the Criminal Code to separate the crimes of shooting at a motor vehicle and shooting from a motor vehicle and to provide penalties. Both crimes are considered violent felonies. Makes conforming changes to the Motor Vehicle Code to clarify that mandatory license revocation applies in either case.
