BILL SUMMARY

SB 55 amends requirements for residential property insurance, specifically regarding the payment of depreciation. The key provisions include:

Settlement Payment Structure:

- Insurers must initially pay 100% of the replacement cost, minus depreciation.
- The remaining amount, up to the replacement cost or policy limits, is to be paid upon completion of repairs or replacement.
