#### **SECTION III: NARRATIVE**

#### **BILL SUMMARY**

The bill amends existing law in 30-1-8 NMSA to enlarge timelimits to initiate prosecution of the following criminal sexual penetration (CSP) crimes until the victim reaches the age of thirty-five:

- CSP through use of force or coercion on a victim aged thirteen to eighteen,
- CSP on a juvenile inmate perpetrated by a person in a position of authority over the inmate.
- CSP through use of force or coercion resulting in victim injury, when the injury is not great bodily harm,
- *CSP through use of force or coercion when there are multiple offenders,*
- *CSP by a school employee or volunteer when the victim is a student.*

The amendment excludes statutory rape which has a shorter time limitation for prosecution, and rape with great bodily harm, rape in the commission of another felony, rape when armed with a deadly weapon and all rapes of children under age 13 which would have no statutes of limitation.

The bill re-letters subsections to add the new subsections.

The bill amends the existing tolling statute at 30-1-9.1 NMSA for initiation of prosecution of statutory rape to permit the time to be tolled until the victim reaches her/his eighteenth birthday or reports to law enforcement.

#### Synopsis:

The bill permits a longer period to elapse for prosecution of criminal sexual penetration crimes.

#### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Many childhood sex offenses are not disclosed at the time of the offense. Permitting later prosecution of these crimes may minimize trauma to crime victims and hold offenders accountable.

# CONFLICT, DUPLICATION, COMPANIONSHIP, RELATIONSHIP

HB 73 retroactively removes statutes of limitations for civil remedies for crimes against children. SB 74 also amends 30-1-8 by adding human trafficking offenses to the list of offenses for which there is no statute of limitations.

## **TECHNICAL ISSUES**

The amendments to 30-1-8 NMSA seem to this author to be tolling language that might fit more closely with the purpose and language of 30-1-9.1 NMSA.
