BILL SUMMARY

If enacted SB 102 would:

Require the Department of Health to evaluate the impact of the provision of a Universal Basic Income to pregnant individuals through the creation of a pilot program.

Direct the Department of Health to administer a 2-year pilot program that provides a \$1,500 per month UBC for pregnant individuals who participate in the program through the first year of the infant's life.

Direct the Department of Health to develop an application process for eligible participants, as well as develop a control group and a treat group of participants for the duration of the pilot project study period.

Participants in the Treat group will be required to participate in home visiting services, either from DOH staff or an agency selected by DOH; Attend prenatal health appointments at the frequency recommended by the healthcare provider; Participate in ongoing research related surveys and forms for the duration of the program.

Participants who are unable to comply with the above requirements shall be placed in the pilot study control group.

Direct the Department of Health to report on the findings of the project to the Legislative body no later than December 2027.

Make an appropriation of eighty million dollars (\$80,000,00) from the state general fund to the Department of Health for expenditure in fiscal years 2026 and 2027.
