SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: Senate Bill 113 (SB113)

SB113 amends certain sections of the New Mexico Statutes Annotated to provide new sunset dates for the following boards or commissions:

- (1) Section 1 extends the date of termination for the Board of Nursing Home Administrators, authorized by the Nursing Home Administrator Act, §§ 61-13-1 to 17 NMSA 1978, until July 1, 2031, allowing the board to operate until July 1, 2032;
- (2) Section 2 extends the date of termination for the Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists, authorized by the Barbers and Cosmetologists Act, §§ 61-17A-1 to 25 NMSA 1978, until July 1, 2031, allowing the board to operate until July 1, 2032;
- (3) Section 3 extends the date of termination for the Board of Landscape Architects, authorized by the Landscape Architects Act, §§ 61-24B-1 to 17 NMSA 1978, until July 1, 2031, allowing the board to operate until July 1, 2032;
- (4) Section 4 extends the date of termination for the Coal Surface Mining Commission, authorized by the Surface Mining Act, §§ 69-25A-1 to 36 NMSA 1978, until July 1, 2031, allowing the board to operate until July 1, 2032; and
- (5) Section 5 extends the date of termination for the Water Quality Control Commission, authorized by the Water Quality Act, §§ 74-6-1 to 17 NMSA 197874-6-17 until July 1, 2031, allowing the board to operate until July 1, 2032;

Sections 1, 2, and 3 of SB113 address the sunset dates for boards under the authority of the Boards and Commissions Division of the Regulation and Licensing Department (RLD).

Sections 4 and 5 of SB113 addresses the sunset dates for commissions under the authority of the Energy, Minerals, and Natural Resources Department.

The effective date of the legislation is June 20, 2025.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The RLD anticipates no additional fiscal impact to the Department beyond the annual

appropriations made to support the ordinary operations of the boards and commissions that will have their existence/duties extended if SB113 is enacted.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

All three boards (Nursing Home Administrators, Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists, and Landscape Architects) operating under administrative attachment to the Boards and Commissions Division of RLD have indicated their support for the continuation of their respective board's current operations and duties.

WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL

Without the extension of the sunset dates, the boards and commissions listed in this statute will no longer exist, and the following Acts will be entirely repealed: Board of Nursing Home Administrators §§ 61-13-1 to 17 NMSA 1978, Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists, §§ 61-17A-1 to 25 NMSA 1978, and Board of Landscape Architects §§ 61-24B-1 to 17 NMSA 1978.

If SB 113 is not passed, the licensing of nursing home administrators, barbers and cosmetologists, and landscape architects would no longer occur, endangering the health and safety of New Mexico's residents.
