BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Section 1 of SB154 defines the term "moving traffic violation" and provides that a court shall not defer the sentence of a person who commits a moving traffic violation if that person has had a sentence for a moving traffic violation deferred within the past year.

Section 2 of SB154 amends NMSA 31-20-3 to ensure that the proposed terms of SB154 override existing legislation generally allowing courts to defer or suspend sentencing of most crimes. Within this section, there is also a technical amendment to NMSA 31-20-3 properly identifying the NM corrections department (not the department of corrections).

Section 3 of SB154 would make the law applicable to traffic violations occurring after the effective date of the act.

Section 4 of SB154 provides an effective date of July 1, 2025.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

SB154 would potentially increase penalties for certain repeat offenders of "moving traffic violations", as defined, by eliminating the possibility of serial deferred sentences.

SB154 uses the term "within the past year", which may be vague as written. The language as written may logically be construed either as "the immediately prior 365 days" or "the last calendar year". Whichever meaning is intended could be more clearly articulated.
