BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: Senate Bill 154 would amend the Motor Vehicle Code to prohibit a court from deferring a sentence of a person who commits a moving traffic violation if that person has, within the past year, had a sentence for a moving traffic violation deferred.

- "Moving traffic violation," in this context, means:
- Failure to obey traffic-control devices or signals
- Speeding
- Failure to yield
- Reckless driving
- Careless driving
- Racing on highways.

Applies to violations of traffic laws that occur on or after the effective date, July 1, 2025.
