BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> Senate Bill 187 would amend the Criminal Sentencing Act to reinstate the death penalty for a murder, only if the aggravating circumstance was (1) that the victim was a peace officer acting in lawful discharge of an official duty at the time; or (2) the defendant targeted the victim because of the victim's status as a peace officer.

Current law provides aggravating circumstances for the crime of murder, including murder of a peace officer acting in lawful discharge of an official duty, but provides for life imprisonment without possibility of release or parole.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Reinstating the death penalty in New Mexico under specific circumstances would likely lead to an increase in costs for the Corrections Department due to higher facility maintenance, staffing, training, security, legal expenses, and long-term management of death row inmates.
