BILL SUMMARY

Amends the Health Care Authority Act to statutorily create the Homelessness Reduction Division, the Interagency Homelessness Reduction Task Force and the Homelessness Reduction Advisory Council. Specifies duties and general structure for each entity and appropriates \$1 million (GF) to the HCA for use in FY2026 to fund the operations of all three. Effective date is July 1, 2025.
