SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> Senate Bill 206 (SB206) would make several changes to the Procurement Code, which are detailed below. These include training for chief procurement officers (CPOs), additional exemptions from the Code, provisions relating to sealed bids, and several new or amended definitions.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Increasing the dollar threshold from \$60,000 to \$100,000 would create additional flexibility for the agency by allowing for easier contracting without the need for an RFP. Additionally, the increase to 13-1-98 J would greatly assist the agency in covering higher subscription and registration fees.

The financial impact on agencies could be reduced by allowing CPO certifications to be renewed through continuing education units, which are often free. This option would also provide CPOs with valuable educational opportunities to enhance their skills and expertise.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Page 12 states: *K. contracts for the digitization of state or federal records* are exempt from the procurement code. Comment: The digitization process may also require the physical transfer of documents, transmission of electronic records, and storage costs of data based on the type of records or documents.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

SB206 could help the HCA more effectively and quickly enter into contracts with qualified vendors, improving agency performance and reducing lengthy RFPs for relatively small contract amounts.
