#### **BILL SUMMARY**

##### Synopsis:

Sente Bill 264 relates to administrative fees; amending certain game and fish licensing fees and allowing the state game commission to increase the fees based on inflation. It will also extend the sunset date of the spay and neuter program fee 76-19A-10, repealing certain laws; making appropriations.

The only impact to the NM Board of Veterinary Medicine will be the extension of the sunset date for the spay and neuter program fee.

#### **FISCAL IMPLICATIONS**

The NM Board of Veterinary Medicine will receive from the NM department of agriculture, approximately one million two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$1,250,000) annually for the spay and neuter program.

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

With this bill, it will extend the sunset of Section 76-19A-10, spay and neuter program funds from July 1, 2026, to July 1, 2031.
