SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: Appropriates reverting \$2.5M General Fund each to the University of New Mexico (UNM) and New Mexico State Uuniversity (NMSU) to fund student athletes in FY26.

The SEC amendments to SB 268 amends the appropriation language to fund "student athletes" instead of "athletics", and removes language to make NMSU's \$2.5M contingent on its hiring an Athletics Director with at least 5 years of name, image and likeness (NIL) policy experience.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The \$2.5 million in funding will have a significant positive fiscal impact on the University of New Mexico by ensuring sustained support for the academic needs of student-athletes and addressing increased and inflationary costs related to team travel, cost of attendance, student-athlete welfare (e.g., nutrition, athletic training services, mental health services), and educational opportunities. This investment directly supports recruitment, retention, graduation, and gender equity initiatives. The state previously allocated a one-time \$1 million General Fund appropriation for the 2024-25 fiscal year to partially implement these efforts. The additional \$2.5 million will allow for the continuation and expansion of these initiatives, ensuring full funding for the cost of attendance in the 2025-26 fiscal year, the expansion of critical student-athlete welfare initiatives and services, and enhancing long-term student-athlete success. All funding will be used directly for student athletes as detailed above.

The absence of this funding could directly impact the department's ability to enhance gender equity and student welfare initiatives, limiting opportunities for student-athletes and weakening overall program effectiveness. Without these resources, the department may struggle to remain competitive and compliant with evolving NCAA policies, potentially leading to gaps in support that affect student-athlete performance and development. Furthermore, the inability to secure this funding may reduce the institution's capacity to attract and retain top talent, ultimately diminishing academic and athletic outcomes and compromising the program's long-term success.

WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL

If this bill is not enacted, the UNM Athletics Department will face significant challenges in supporting the academic needs of student-athletes, potentially impacting recruitment, retention, and graduation rates. Without the additional \$2.5 million, the ability to fully fund the cost of attendance in the 2025-26 fiscal year will be compromised, limiting financial support for student-athletes and creating disparities in academic-based opportunities. Additionally, the absence of this funding could hinder progress toward gender equity and student welfare initiatives, weakening the department's ability to remain competitive and compliant with evolving NCAA policies. Failure to secure this funding may reduce the institution's ability to attract and retain top student-athletes, negatively affecting overall program success.

With state support, the UNM Athletics Department has made significant strides in recent years to strengthen its reputation for fiscal sustainability and transparency while enhancing the student-athlete experience and maintaining compliance with evolving regulations. These efforts have also reinforced the department's competitive standing among peer institutions. However, without additional funding, the department risks losing this progress, potentially undermining its financial stability, student support initiatives, and competitive edge.
