#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Synopsis: SB 315 amends the law related to New Mexico state symbols (which currently includes the state: flower, bird, tree, fish, animal, vegetables, gem, grass, fossil, insect, question, answer, nickname, butterfly, reptile, amphibian, aircraft, railroad, tie, necklace, and aroma) to include the tortilla as the official bread of New Mexico.

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

SB 315 would add the tortilla within the list of New Mexico state symbols as the state's official bread.

The New Mexico Tourism Department currently promotes the cuisine and symbolic elements of New Mexico. The inclusion of tortillas is currently a part of those efforts as a foundational part of New Mexico's cuisine.
