SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

This bill adds in new provisions in the Adoption Act for "confirmatory adoptions". This is an action for a parent or parents of a child(ren) born through assisted reproduction. It establishes provisions to confirm parentage of the child(ren) and obtain a judgment of adoption.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

There could be competing issues on what pleadings should be filed to determine parentage when assisted reproduction is used even when there is a presumed parent. However, there may be a minimal impact on CSSD as the court will make any decisions on the validity of any outstanding assisted reproduction issues. Adoption issues are likely to be resolved by the time adoptive parents would apply for CSSD services.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

This bill could impact CSSD's federal performance measures which include, but not limited to, parentage establishment and cost effectiveness ratio.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

CSSD Business processes could change depending on the actions needed to determine parentage when a confirmatory adoption should have taken place and has not.

It is anticipated that any IT system updates required for the Child Support Enforcement System (CSES) such as modernizing language, and updating family structures or order types will be conducted under existing or future contracts and will be completed at no additional cost. Work could not start, however, until state fiscal year 2026.

CONFLICT, DUPLICATION, COMPANIONSHIP, RELATIONSHIP

There are two bills attempting to make revisions/updates to the Uniform Parentage Act, §40-11A-101 through 40-11A-903, NMSA 1978.

<u>HB 373</u> revises the Uniform Parentage Act (UPA) to define an "intended parent" as "an individual, married or unmarried, who manifests an intent to be legally bound as a parent of a child conceived by assisted reproduction" that includes the ability of an "intended parent" to sign an Acknowledgment of Parentage (AOP) which is the equivalent to an adjudication of parentage. Whereas <u>SB 417</u> seems to imply that parents who use assisted reproduction must confirm parentage through the use of a "confirmatory adoption" and obtain a judgment of adoption
