SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

SB437 establishes that corporal punishment shall not be used in New Mexico in early childhood education and care and primary and secondary education. Further, SB437 prohibits the state and political subdivisions of the state from offering any grants or benefits to early childhood education and care and primary and secondary education entities unless they have adopted a policy or agreed in writing to forbid the use of corporal punishment on the premises.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

As reviewed, no fiscal implications for ECECD.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

No significant issues have been identified by ECECD. Corporal punishment is linked to negative outcomes for children, including physical and mental ill-health, impaired cognitive and socio-emotional development, poor educational outcomes, increased aggression, and perpetration of violence. Though ECECD's licensing regulations prohibit the use of physical punishment of any type, including shaking, biting, hitting, pinching or putting anything on or in a child's mouth, placing the prohibition of corporal punishment into statute will further protect the health and wellbeing of the children that ECECD serves.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

None.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

ECECD currently addresses the use of corporal punishment in regulation at 8.9.4.24(A)(4) NMAC. If SB437 passes, ECECD may need to promulgate changes to its regulations to more closely align with the requirements of SB347.
