SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

SB 489 amends Section 32A-6A-15 NMSA 1978 related to consent for services for children fourteen years of age or older by allowing for court-ordered behavioral health services or treatment if the court determines it is in the best interest of the child and is necessary to promote the child's health, safety or welfare.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SB 489 does not include any allocation for CYFD. Currently, CYFD enrolls children in state custody into Medicaid, as applicable, and secures federal funds to support behavioral health services and other supports for children in state custody.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

SB 489 address the ability to consent to treatment for children fourteen years of age and older. Additional language is added regarding children who have been adjudicated as abused or neglected and are under the jurisdiction of the children's court. The additions speak only for children in custody of CYFD and adjudicated, allowing the court to order a youth over the age of 14 to treatment if they deem them a danger to self or others.
