BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

SB518 appropriates \$50,000 from the general fund to the Board of Regents of the University of New Mexico to support maternity and infant care programs in fiscal year 2026. An additional \$50,000 is appropriated to support the University of New Mexico Hospital Young Children's Health Center in fiscal year 2026. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance would revert to the general fund at the end of FY26.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Maternal and child health programs provide women and children with essential services that support the well-being of mothers, children, and their families. Investing in these programs leads to healthier pregnancies, improved birth outcomes, and promotes child development. The Young Children's Health Center provides an array of bilingual (Spanish/English) services to families with children in Albuquerque's southeast heights. These services include home visiting, behavioral health services, case management, dental services, and substance abuse services. The clinic also provides pregnancy and infant care.
