11	RELATING TO ANIMALS; CREATING THE ANIMAL WELFARE PROGRAM TO
12	PROVIDE FUNDING FOR PROJECTS THAT SUPPORT THE WELFARE OF
13	DOMESTIC CATS AND DOGS; CREATING THE ANIMAL WELFARE PROGRAM
14	FUND.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] ANIMAL WELFARE PROGRAM
18	A. The "animal welfare program" is created to
19	provide funding for projects that support the welfare of
20	domestic cats and dogs as provided in this section. Beginning
21	July 1, 2025, the department may award a grant to a
22	municipality or county or an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo, or
23	contract for services with an eligible entity, for a project to
24	repair, renovate or operate an animal shelter, provided that a
25	grant to repair or renovate shall only be for publicly owned
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1	facilities, and to purchase equipment and supplies or provide
2	services for:
3	(1) controlling loose or stray cats and dogs
4	to mitigate threats to public safety, livestock or other
5	domestic animals;
6	(2) improving the enforcement of animal
7	cruelty laws, including investigation and response to reports
8	of animal cruelty;
9	(3) reducing animal shelter intake and
10	euthanasia rates or expanding animal shelter building facility
11	capacity;
12	(4) providing spay and neuter services;
13	(5) providing shelter and care for cats and
14	dogs seized by law enforcement that are suspected of being
15	cruelly treated in violation of local, state or federal laws;
16	(6) developing, publishing or distributing
17	animal welfare education and outreach materials to the public;
18	or
19	(7) providing persons with essential resources
20	necessary to care for animals in a person's custody, including
21	animal feed, adequate shelter, fencing and kennels and basic or
22	emergency veterinary care, including spay and neuter services;
23	provided that the household income of the person shall not
24	exceed two hundred percent of the federal poverty level.
25	B. To receive a grant or contract for services, an
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applicant shall apply to the department on forms and in a manner prescribed by the department. An application shall include:

(1)

a description of the proposed project; a demonstration that the proposed project (2) will meet one or more of the purposes provided in Subsection A of this section; and

details and specifics as to the reasonable (3) expected costs and completion date of the proposed project.

The department shall determine, through a 10 С. competitive review process pursuant to rules promulgated by the 11 12 department, which proposed projects are approved to receive a grant or contract for services. The department may adjust the 13 amount of money requested for a proposed project based on its 14 determination of the reasonable costs of the proposal. Once 15 the projects are approved, the department shall promptly offer 16 each applicant a grant or contract for services, as 17 appropriate. If a grantee or contractor accepts an offer, the 18 project may commence and the grantee or contractor shall report 19 to the department on the progress of the project on a periodic 20 basis, as determined by the department, including an accounting 21 of expenditures made for the project. Funds allocated to an 22 approved project shall be spent within two years of receiving a 23 grant or contract for services, and if any unexpended or 24 unencumbered balance remains at the end of the project period, 25

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1	the applicant shall immediately return that balance to the
2	department. The department shall deposit returned amounts in
3	the animal welfare program fund.
4	D. The department shall promulgate rules to
5	administer the animal welfare program. The rules shall include
6	provisions to:
7	(1) establish procedures for review,
8	evaluation and approval of proposed project applications;
9	(2) accord priority attention to areas with
10	the greatest need for animal welfare projects; and
11	(3) evaluate the ability and competence of an
12	applicant to provide efficiently and adequately for the
13	completion of a proposed project.
14	E. On October 1 of each year, the department shall
15	submit a report to the legislative finance committee on the
16	animal welfare program that shall include:
17	(1) for each funded project:
18	(a) a description of the project;
19	(b) the name of the grantee or
20	contractor;
21	(c) how much funding the project
22	received;
23	(d) the progress or completion of the
24	project; and
25	(e) how the project supports animal
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1	welfare;
2	(2) the number and proposed costs of proposed
3	projects that were approved for but did not receive funding due
4	to the insufficiency of available funds for the animal welfare
5	program; and
6	(3) the total amount of administrative costs
7	incurred by the department to administer the program.
8	F. As used in this section:
9	(1) "department" means the department of
10	finance and administration;
11	(2) "eligible entity" means a nonprofit
12	organization whose primary purpose is to provide services that
13	support the welfare of domestic cats and dogs; and
14	(3) "equipment and supplies" means vehicles,
15	equipment and tools, computer hardware and software, training
16	materials and supplies that are necessary and directly related
17	to providing support for animal welfare.
18	SECTION 2. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] ANIMAL WELFARE PROGRAM FUND
19	The "animal welfare program fund" is created as a nonreverting
20	fund in the state treasury. The fund consists of
21	appropriations, gifts, grants and donations. The department of
22	finance and administration shall administer the fund, and money
23	in the fund is appropriated to the department to administer the
24	animal welfare program. Expenditures from the fund shall be by
25	warrant of the secretary of finance and administration pursuant
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	2	administration or the secretary's authorized representative.					
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
