16	SECTION 1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] OFFICE OF HOUSING PLANNING AND

19	A. As used in this section, "housing" means real
20	property and infrastructure that is residential housing,
21	including rental housing, the housing portion of a mixed-use
22	commercial and housing project and commercial property that is
23	repurposed for residential housing.
24	B. The "office of housing planning and production"
25	is created and is administratively attached to the department

The department shall provide 2 administrative services for the office. 3 The purpose of the office of housing planning C. 4 and production is to: 5 reduce housing costs; (1)6 (2)increase statewide housing availability, 7 including housing for low-income and homeless households; 8 maximize resources to address statewide (3) 9 housing needs; 10 (4) address the underlying factors that are 11 impacting housing costs and limited supply; 12 grow local programs and capacity to (5) 13 address housing needs and further fair housing; 14 identify state resources for housing; and (6) 15 track housing progress through goal (7) 16 setting and data. 17 The director of the office of housing planning D. 18 and production shall be appointed by the governor. Subject to 19 appropriations, the director may employ technical and clerical 20 assistants as necessary to carry out the powers and duties of 21 the office. 22 The office of housing planning and production Ε. 23 shall: 24 (1) develop a statewide strategy to build 25 collaborative partnerships among state agencies and local .230939.1GLG - 2 -

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stakeholders in addressing housing and homelessness, aligning
 programs and identifying resources;

3 (2) provide technical assistance to local
4 governments, Indian nations, tribes and pueblos and regional
5 entities to improve housing regulation, further fair housing,
6 increase housing development capacity and housing funding, grow
7 local and statewide capacity for homelessness services and
8 prevention and promote public-private housing partnerships;

9 (3) align resources across state agencies and
10 the private sector to identify new programs to increase
11 capacity in housing finance and housing development and to grow
12 the construction and trades workforces;

(4) address the underlying factors that impact housing costs and availability, regardless of income, by, at a minimum:

(a) analyzing regulatory frameworks surrounding land use and zoning, building codes, permitting and inspection processes and utility and road connections;

(b) analyzing construction costs associated with workforce shortages and supply chain constraints; and

(c) promoting new approaches to housing, including modular, manufactured and tiny homes and new construction technologies;

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1 governments toward housing production and fair housing goals; 2 analyze housing and economic development (9) 3 investments and initiatives, measure impacts of state, regional 4 and local housing programs, monitor state and local efforts, 5 support local efforts to meet defined housing goals, make 6 necessary policy changes and investments to achieve housing 7 goals and make findings publicly available; 8 (10) create a framework for local governments 9 to set goals for meeting housing needs across income levels; 10 (11) grow local ability to meet housing needs 11 by: 12 (a) working with local governments on land use and zoning, permit, inspection and building codes; 13 14 supporting capacity building at the (b) 15 local and regional level for new housing programs; and 16 (c) using goal setting frameworks and 17 land use outcome data to create accountability to solve 18 problems locally; 19 (12)identify ways that existing programs and 20 capacities can address housing needs; 21 (13) provide support to state agencies 22 undertaking housing and housing-adjacent activities; and 23 (14) perform nonduplicative duties assigned by 24 the governor or the legislature to ensure that the state meets 25 or exceeds the state's housing goals. .230939.1GLG - 5 -
