3	APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE EXPENSE OF THE FIFTY-SEVENTH
4	LEGISLATURE, FIRST SESSION, 2025, AND FOR OTHER LEGISLATIVE
5	EXPENSES, INCLUDING THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SERVICE, THE
6	LEGISLATIVE FINANCE COMMITTEE, THE LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION
7	STUDY COMMITTEE, THE SENATE RULES COMMITTEE, THE HOUSE CHIEF
8	CLERK'S OFFICE, THE SENATE CHIEF CLERK'S OFFICE AND OTHER
9	EXPENSES OF THE LEGISLATURE; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
12	SECTION 1. SESSION EXPENSES
13	A. There is appropriated from the general fund for
14	the expense of the legislative department of the state of New
15	Mexico for the first session of the fifty-seventh legislature
16	for per diem and mileage of its members, for salaries of
17	employees and for other expenses of the legislature, eleven
18	million four hundred forty-seven thousand eight hundred
19	dollars (\$11,447,800) or so much thereof as may be necessary
20	for such purposes.
21	B. The expenditures referred to in Subsection A of
22	this section are as follows:
23	(1) per diem for senators \$550,700;
24	(2) per diem for members of the house of
25	representatives

1 (3) mileage traveled by members of the 2 senate going to and returning from the seat of government by 3 the usually traveled route, one round trip. \$7,800; 4 (4) mileage traveled by members of the house 5 of representatives going to and returning from the seat of 6 government by the usually traveled route, one round trip. 7 \$12,900; (5) salaries and employee benefits of senate 8 9 \$3,500,000; 10 (6) salaries and employee benefits of house of representatives employees. \$3,490,700; 11 for expense of the senate not itemized 12 (7) above, two hundred twenty thousand four hundred dollars 13 (\$220,400). No part of this item may be transferred to 14 15 salaries or employee benefits; for expense of the house of 16 (8) representatives not itemized above, five hundred six thousand 17 two hundred dollars (\$506,200). No part of this item may be 18 transferred to salaries or employee benefits; and 19 20 (9) for session expenses of the legislative council service, the joint billroom and mailroom and joint 21 legislative switchboard, two million two hundred forty-one 22 thousand four hundred dollars (\$2,241,400) to be disbursed 23 upon vouchers signed by the director of the legislative 24 25 council service or the director's designee.

1 C. The expenditures for the senate shall be 2 disbursed on vouchers signed by the chair of the committees' 3 committee and the chief clerk of the senate or the chief 4 clerk's designee. The expenditures for the house of 5 representatives shall be disbursed on vouchers signed by the 6 speaker and chief clerk of the house or the chief clerk's designee. Following adjournment of the session, expenditures 7 8 authorized pursuant to Paragraphs (1) through (8) of Subsection B of this section shall be disbursed upon vouchers 9 10 signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee. 11

Under the printing contracts entered into for 12 D. the first session of the fifty-seventh legislature, the chair 13 of the committees' committee of the senate, subject to the 14 15 approval of the committee, and the speaker of the house of representatives are authorized and directed to provide for 16 the printing of all bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, 17 memorials and joint memorials introduced in the senate or 18 house, the printing of the bill locator and the printing of 19 20 all necessary stationery required for use in the respective houses. They are further directed to provide for the 21 purchase of all supplies necessary for use in the respective 22 houses within the appropriation provided. The orders for 23 printing, stationery and supplies shall be approved by the 24 25 chair of the committees' committee in the senate or by the

speaker of the house.

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2	SECTION 2. BILLS AND OTHER PRINTED MATERIALSFor the
3	first session of the fifty-seventh legislature, bills,
4	resolutions, joint resolutions, memorials and joint memorials
5	delivered to the printer shall be returned by the printer to
6	the joint billroom within forty-two hours after they are
7	ordered to be printed. The billroom personnel shall supply a
8	complete file of bills, resolutions, joint resolutions,
9	memorials, joint memorials and other printed distribution
10	materials to the following:
11	A. upon request, one copy to each member of the

13	B. upon written request, one copy to each county

LEGISLATURE.--There is appropriated from the 7 general fund, unless otherwise indicated, for the expense of 8 the legislative department, not provided for in Section 1 of 9 this act, for expenditure in fiscal year 2026, unless 10 otherwise indicated, to be disbursed on vouchers signed by 11 the director of the legislative council service or the 12 director's designee, the following: 13 for travel expenses of legislators other than 14 Α. 15 New Mexico legislative council members, on legislative council business, for committee travel, staff and other 16 necessary expenses for other interim committees and for other 17 necessary legislative expenses, four million dollars 18 (\$4,000,000); provided that the New Mexico legislative 19 20 council may transfer amounts from the appropriation in this subsection, during the fiscal years for which appropriated, 21 to any other legislative appropriation where they may be 22 needed; 23

24B. for pre-session expenditures and for necessary25contracts, supplies and personnel for interim sessionHB

1 preparation, five hundred ten thousand dollars (\$510,000); 2 for a statewide legislative intern program, C. 3 sixty-one thousand eight hundred dollars (\$61,800); 4 D. for dues and fees of national organizations of 5 which the legislature is a member, four hundred sixty-five 6 thousand eight hundred dollars (\$465,800); for the legislative information system, for 7 Ε. 8 fiscal years 2025 and 2026, three million one hundred 9 eighty-eight thousand nine hundred dollars (\$3,188,900); 10 F. for the interim duties of the senate rules committee, thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000); 11 G. for the contractual services of the capitol 12 buildings planning commission, two hundred fifty-seven 13 thousand five hundred dollars (\$257,500); 14 15 Η. for legislative district staff, including 16 salaries and benefits, information technology equipment and software, furniture, supplies, office space and other 17 necessary support, fourteen million dollars (\$14,000,000). 18 Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end 19 20 of fiscal year 2026 from the appropriation in this subsection shall revert to the general fund; 21 I. for expenditure in fiscal years 2026 through 22 2028 from legislative cash balances for equipment, furniture, 23 upgrades and repairs for the state capitol complex, four 24 million dollars (\$4,000,000); 25

J. for expenditure in fiscal years 2025 and 2026 from legislative cash balances for the ongoing planning, output development and design of a legislative processing system, five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000); and K. for expenditure in fiscal years 2025 and 2026

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from legislative cash balances for the New Mexico legislature's support of the legislative clerks and secretaries section of the national conference of state legislatures to perform such functions as are necessary to prepare for the 2025 annual meeting to be held in Santa Fe, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000).

SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE FINANCE COMMITTEE.--There is appropriated from the general fund to the legislative finance committee, to be disbursed upon vouchers signed by the chair of the committee or the chair's designated representative:

SECTION 9. OFFICIAL MASTER DATABASE OF LAWS--SELF-9 10 PUBLICATION--FREE ACCESS TECHNOLOGY--HARD-COPY PUBLICATION.--There is appropriated from the legislative cash balances for 11 the legislative department's share of the continued 12 development required for the master database of official 13 annotated laws of the state, markup language and tagging and 14 15 its use for legislative document systems and a tagged database of the session laws and for the costs associated in 16 collaborating with the New Mexico compilation commission on 17 the ongoing development and expanding partnership role with 18 the New Mexico compilation commission in the self-publication 19 20 of the New Mexico Statutes Annotated 1978, including technology for freely accessible laws and hard-copy 21 publication, four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) for 22 expenditure during fiscal years 2025 and 2026. 23

24 SECTION 10. CATEGORY TRANSFER.--Amounts set out in25 Sections 3 through 8 of this act are provided for

informational purposes only and may be transferred among categories. SECTION 11. PERFORMANCE MEASURES.--Each legislative agency shall adhere to the performance measures specified in its strategic plan and shall make reports as required in that plan. SECTION 12.
