SUMMARY

Synopsis of House Bill 115

Senate Bill 115 appropriates \$859 thousand from the general fund to the Health Care Authority (HCA) to provide funding to an organization located in Doña Ana County that uses a Soteria model to provide long-term residential treatment services for people diagnosed with serious mental illness and psychosis.

This bill does not contain an effective date and, as a result, would go into effect 90 days after the Legislature adjourns if enacted, or June 20, 2025.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$859 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY26 shall revert to the general fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The Department of Health (DOH) provided the following:

The "Soteria model," implemented in Soteria Houses, is based on a recovery model. The common elements of the Soteria approach include the use of primarily nonmedical staff, who do not prescribe or administer antipsychotic medication to patients, and the

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preservation of residents' personal power, social networks, and communal responsibilities.

There is a need for residential level of care for people with behavioral health diagnoses in the state, but without knowing specifics about this program such as its capacity, revenue, average census, admission and discharge criteria, it is difficult to determine the broad impact of the model.
