### AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR VARIOUS PROJECTS IN SENATE DISTRICT 3 IN SAN JUAN COUNTY; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--PURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED--APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding one million eighty-one thousand dollars (\$1,081,000) when the New Mexico office of Indian affairs certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible

upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs in the following amounts for the following purposes:

- (\$350,000) to make necessary improvements to residences of indigent New Mexicans in the Naschitti chapter area in San Juan county;
- (2) three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) to plan, design or construct a preschool classroom facility in the Naschitti chapter area in San Juan county;
- (3) three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) to plan, design or construct a senior citizen center in the Newcomb chapter area in San Juan county; and
- (4) thirty-one thousand dollars (\$31,000) for electrical wiring in residences of indigent New Mexicans in the Sheepsprings chapter area in San Juan county.
- B. If the New Mexico office of Indian affairs has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1998, the authorization provided in this section shall be void. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining

from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to Subsection A of this section at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
