AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS IN THE VILLAGE OF TULAROSA IN OTERO COUNTY; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--AUTHORIZATIONS--APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts authorized for purposes specified in Sections 2 through 6 of this act. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the

project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated for the purposes specified in Sections 2 through 6 of this act.

- B. The agencies named in Sections 2 through 6 of this act shall certify to the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this act.
- C. If the specified agency has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1998, the authorization provided in this act shall be void.
- D. Unless otherwise specified in this act, any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to Sections 2 through 6 of this act at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the department of health that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) is appropriated to the department of health

to plan, design and construct a medical facility and purchase equipment and furnishings for the medical facility in the village of Tularosa located in Otero county.

Section 3. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF

ENVIRONMENT--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1

of this act, upon certification by the department of environment
that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the
following amounts are appropriated to the department of
environment for the following purposes:

- A. two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) to make improvements to the water filter plant in the village of Tularosa in Otero county;
- B. two hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$275,000) to replace the water lines in the village of Tularosa in Otero county; and
- C. two hundred thirty thousand dollars (\$230,000) to purchase equipment for and to make improvements to the wastewater plant in the village of Tularosa in Otero county to comply with standards set by the federal Occupation Safety and Health Act.

Section 4. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--LOCAL GOVERNMENT DIVISION

OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION--PURPOSES.-
Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon

certification by the local government division of the department

of finance and administration that the need exists for the

issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the local government division of the department of finance and administration for the following purposes:

- two hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$275,000) to purchase equipment for and to complete the rehabilitation and expansion of the police department building in the village of Tularosa in Otero county;
- В. one hundred twelve thousand dollars (\$112,000) to purchase equipment for and to renovate the fire department building in the village of Tularosa in Otero county;
- two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) to purchase village yard equipment for the village of Tularosa in Otero county;
- one hundred thirty-nine thousand dollars (\$139,000) to purchase equipment and increase office space in the Tularosa municipal office in Otero county.
- SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE AGENCY ON AGING--Section 5. PURPOSES. -- Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the state agency on aging that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the state agency on aging for the following purposes:
- one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) to repair the roof and the heating and cooling system and expand the supply space at the Tularosa community senior center in the

village of Tularosa in Otero county; and

one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to purchase recreation equipment and make improvements to the baseball and basketball playing fields at the Tularosa community senior center in the village of Tularosa in Otero county.

Section 6. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT -- PURPOSES. -- Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the state highway and transportation department that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the state highway and transportation department for the following purposes:

three hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$325,000) to repair streets in the village of Tularosa in Otero county; and

В. two hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$275,000) to make improvements to west Monterey street between First and Sixth streets in the village of Tularosa in Otero county.

EMERGENCY. -- It is necessary for the public Section 7. peace, health and safety that the provisions of this act take effect immediately.
