AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS TO DESIGN, CONSTRUCT AND EQUIP A PRESCHOOL EDUCATIONAL FACILITY FOR THE NASCHITTI NAVAJO CHAPTER IN SAN JUAN COUNTY; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--PURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED-- APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) when the New Mexico office of Indian affairs certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed

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1 sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can
2 proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board
3 of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to
4 comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The
5 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New
6 Mexico office of Indian affairs for the purpose of designing,
7 constructing and equipping a preschool facility to house
8 preschool and home-based educational services to youth living in
9 and near the Naschitti Navajo chapter community located in San
10 Juan county. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining
11 at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the severance tax
12 bonding fund. If the New Mexico office of Indian affairs has
13 not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end
14 of fiscal year 1998, the authorization provided in this section
15 shall be void.

16 Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public
17 peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
