AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION; ABOLISHING THE STATE TRANSPORTATION
AUTHORITY; TRANSFERRING PERSONNEL, ASSETS AND OBLIGATIONS;
REPEALING THE RESOURCE TRANSPORTATION AND PASSENGER
TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT; AUTHORIZING THE STATE HIGHWAY
COMMISSION TO ISSUE REVENUE BONDS AND REFUNDING BONDS; PROVIDING
THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION WITH THE POWER OF EMINENT DOMAIN;
REPEALING AND ENACTING SECTIONS OF THE NMSA 1978.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of Chapter 67, Article 3 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION--POWERS OF EMINENT DOMAIN.--

A. The state highway commission shall have the power to acquire property by purchase, lease, gift or devise for the

purposes of construction of transportation systems by a private entity.

- The power to acquire property shall be construed B. broadly and shall include the power to acquire property for the construction and maintenance of communication and transportation structures and other facilities necessary for the operation of transportation systems.
- The state highway commission shall have the authority to negotiate for the acquisition of property from any person, governmental entity or Indian tribe or pueblo for the purpose of promoting the development of transportation and passenger transportation facilities."

Section 2. A new section of Chapter 67, Article 3 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] TRANSPORTATION BONDS. - -

A. Whenever the state highway commission by resolution determines that interest or necessity demands the issuance of revenue bonds to finance the development and construction of transportation systems, it may, by resolution, make and issue state revenue bonds which shall be known as "transportation bonds". Such bonds shall be payable solely out of the net income to be derived from the operation of the project and shall pledge, irrevocably, such income to the payment of those bonds. The state board of finance may require such other guarantees as it deems necessary. The bonds shall

never become a general obligation of the state or any political subdi vi si on.

- The proceeds from the sale of transportation B. bonds shall be used solely for the purposes specified in the resolution and for which they were issued."
- Section 3. A new section of Chapter 67, Article 3 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:

TRANSPORTATION BONDS--TERMS. --"[NEW MATERIAL] Transportation bonds issued by the state highway commission:

- shall bear interest which at the time of commitment shall be equal to the market return on comparable investments but shall not be less than the average rate of interest or return on all the investments of the severance tax permanent fund for the immediately preceding fiscal year minus two percentage points previous to their issue;
- shall be payable at such times as the commission may provide and shall be fully registered as to principal and interest:
- C. may be subject to prior redemption at the commission's option at such time and upon such terms and conditions, with or without payment of premiums, as may be provided in the resolution of the commission;
- may mature at any time not exceeding fifty years D. after the date of issuance:
 - may be serial in form and maturity and may Ε.

consist of one bond payable at one time or in installments;

- F. shall be sold for cash at, above or below par and at the effective interest rate permitted in this section; and
 - may be sold at a public or private sale."
- Section 4. A new section of Chapter 67, Article 3 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] REFUNDING BONDS. - -

Transportation bonds issued pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 67, Article 3 NMSA 1978 that are outstanding may at any time and from time to time be refunded by the state highway commission upon the adoption of a resolution providing for such issuance and by the issuance of refunding bonds in such amount as the commission determines to refund the principal of the transportation bonds, all unpaid accrued and unaccrued interest thereon to the normal maturity date of such bonds or to selected prior redemption dates thereof, any redemption premiums, any commission and all estimated costs incidental to the issuance of such bonds and to such refunding as may be determined by the commission.

- The principal amount of any such refunding bonds may be equal to, less than or greater than the principal amount of the bonds so refunded.
- Any refunding may be effected, whether the bonds to be refunded have then matured or thereafter mature, either by sale of the refunding bonds and the application of the proceeds

thereof for the payment of the bonds to be refunded or by exchange of the refunding bonds for the bonds to be refunded; provided that the bonds to be refunded shall not be canceled without the consent of the holders to surrender their bonds for payment or exchange prior to the date on which they are payable or if they are called for redemption prior to the date on which they are by their terms subject to redemption.

- D. Any refunding bonds issued pursuant to this section shall be payable solely from the revenues out of which transportation bonds may be payable or solely from those amounts derived from an escrow as provided in this section, including amounts derived from the investment of refunding bond proceeds and other legally available amounts also provided in this section or from any combination of those sources.
- E. Proceeds of refunding bonds shall either be applied immediately to the retirement of the bonds being refunded or be placed in escrow in a commercial bank or trust company that possesses and is exercising trust powers.

 Notwithstanding any statute to the contrary, such escrowed proceeds may be invested in short-term securities, long-term securities or both."

Section 5. A new section of Chapter 67, Article 3 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] TRANSPORTATION BONDS ELIGIBLE FOR

INVESTMENT. -- Transportation bonds issued by the state highway

commission are hereby made securities in which all public officers and public bodies of this state and its political subdivisions and all insurance companies, trust companies, banking associations, investment companies, executors, administrators, trustees and other fiduciaries may properly and legally invest funds, including capital in their control or belonging to them. Such bonds are securities which may properly and legally be deposited with and be received by any state or political subdivision officer for which the deposit of bonds or obligations of the state is authorized by law. The bonds may be deemed by the state highway commission, with the approval of the state board of finance, certificates of deposit for purposes of the investment of state money, in which case the commission shall be deemed a New Mexico savings and loan association for these purposes only; provided that the state board of finance may waive all collateralization and other requirements as long as it finds the bonds to be comparable in safety to other investments of state funds. No bonds issued by the state highway commission shall be eligible for investment or deposit by or with the state or any of its political subdivisions unless they have been rated AA or higher by an independent nationally recognized bond rating service based solely on the security of the bonds as investments without resort to any collateral No bonds shall be eligible for investment or guarantees. deposit by or with the state or any of its political

subdivisions unless the state highway commission has filed with the legislative finance committee its decision to issue the bonds and all of its findings and reasons in support of the decision and one complete regular session of the legislature has intervened since the filing."

Section 6. A new section to Chapter 67, Article 3 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] TRANSPORTATION BONDS--EXEMPTION FROM
TAXATION.--The construction, operation and maintenance of any
transportation project by the state highway commission will
constitute the performance of an essential governmental
function. As such, any transportation bonds issued pursuant to
Chapter 67, Article 3 NMSA 1978, their transfer and the income
therefrom, including any profit made on the sale thereof, shall
at all times be free from taxation by the state and by its
political subdivisions."

Section 7. TEMPORARY PROVISION--TRANSFER OF PERSONNEL,
ASSETS AND OBLIGATIONS. -- On July 1, 1996:

A. all personnel, appropriations, money, records, property, equipment and supplies of the state transportation authority shall be transferred to the state highway and transportation department; and

B. all contracts, agreements and obligations of the state transportation authority shall be binding and effective on the state highway and transportation department.

REPEAL. -- Sections 73-23-1 through 73-23-13 NMSA Section 8. 1978 (being Laws 1985 (1st. S.S.), Chapter 14, Sections 1 through 13, as amended) are repealed.

EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the Section 9. provisions of this act is July 1, 1996.
