AN ACT

RELATING TO INDIAN CULTURE; ABOLISHING THE INTERTRIBAL INDIAN CEREMONIAL ASSOCIATION; AMENDING AND REPEALING SECTIONS OF THE NMSA 1978; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. [NEW MATERIAL] CITY OF GALLUP--PROMOTION OF INDIAN ARTS, CRAFTS AND CULTURE. -- The city of Gallup shall have the responsibility to encourage the preservation and development of Indian arts and crafts among the Indian tribes and pueblos of the state, as well as preservation of traditional rites and ceremonials of Indian tribes and pueblos to increase knowledge and appreciation of those arts, crafts, rites and ceremonials. The city shall also assist Indian tribes and pueblos in promoting the annual intertribal Indian ceremonial week in Gallup.

Section 3. APPROPRIATION. -- One million dollars (\$1,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the local government division of the department of finance and administration for expenditure in fiscal years 1997 through 1999 for the city of Gallup to carry out the provisions of Section 1 of this act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund.

REPEAL. -- Sections 28-12-1 through 28-12-3 NMSA Section 4. 1978 (being Laws 1939, Chapter 42, Section 1 and Laws 1967, Chapter 299, Sections 1 and 2) are repealed.

Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 1996.
