AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS-- AUTHORIZATIONS-- APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts authorized for purposes specified in Sections 2 through 24 of this act. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance

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1 and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable
2 time. The state board of finance shall further take the
3 appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue
4 Code of 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds
5 are appropriated for the purposes specified in Sections 2
6 through 24 of this act.

7 B. The agencies named in Sections 2 through 24 of
8 this act shall certify to the state board of finance when the
9 money from the proceeds of the severance tax bonds authorized in
10 this section is needed for the purposes specified in the
11 applicable sections of this act.

12 C. If the specified agency has not certified the
13 need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year
14 1998, the authorization provided in this act shall be void.

15 D. Unless otherwise specified in this act, any
16 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the proceeds
17 from severance tax bonds issued pursuant to Sections 2 through
18 24 of this act after fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the
19 severance tax bonding fund.

20 Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE AGENCY ON AGING--
21 PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act,
22 upon certification by the state agency on aging that the need
23 exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are
24 appropriated to the state agency on aging for the following
25 purposes:

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1 A. three hundred seventy thousand dollars (\$370,000)
2 for renovation and improvement of the existing structure and
3 designing, constructing, equipping and furnishing an addition to
4 the North Mesa senior citizen center in Carlsbad in Eddy county;

5 B. sixty-five thousand dollars (\$65,000) to complete
6 construction of additions or improvements to or to equip and
7 furnish the Corona senior citizen center in Lincoln county;

8 C. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) to
9 plan, design, construct or renovate the senior citizen center in
10 Deming located in Luna county;

11 D. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the
12 purpose of planning, designing, constructing or equipping a
13 senior citizen meal site in Artesia in Eddy county;

14 E. fifty thousand eight hundred ninety-five dollars
15 (\$50,895) for the purchase of vehicles or equipment for the
16 Dulce senior citizen center in Rio Arriba county;

17 F. thirty-nine thousand two hundred forty dollars
18 (\$39,240) for purchasing and equipping vehicles for handicapped
19 and elderly persons for the senior citizen center at Dulce in
20 Rio Arriba county;

21 G. forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000) to plan,
22 design or construct the Arrey senior center in Sierra county and
23 to make other improvements in order to comply with the federal
24 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990;

25 H. one hundred five thousand dollars (\$105,000) to

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1 plan, design or construct the McIntosh senior citizen center
2 located in Torrance county;

3 I. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the purpose
4 of designing, constructing, including infrastructure work, and
5 equipping a senior citizen center in Shiprock located in San
6 Juan county;

7 J. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the
8 purpose of designing, constructing and equipping a senior
9 citizen center in Sanostee located in San Juan county;

10 K. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
11 design, construct and equip a new permanent meal site building
12 for senior citizens in the vicinity of Wyoming and Paseo del
13 Norte in the northeast heights section of Albuquerque in
14 Bernalillo county;

15 L. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
16 purchase a handicapped-equipped van with a wheelchair lift that
17 complies with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of
18 1990 for the city of Grants located in Cibola county;

19 M. one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars
20 (\$175,000) for renovations and to purchase vehicles and meal
21 site and other equipment for the Isleta pueblo senior center
22 located in Bernalillo county;

23 N. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to design,
24 construct or equip a senior citizen center in the town of
25 Springer in Colfax county; and

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1 0. thirty-four thousand dollars (\$34,000) for
2 recreational equipment for the San Jose senior citizen center in
3 Carlsbad in Eddy county.

4 Section 3. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--OFFICE OF CULTURAL
5 AFFAIRS--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of
6 this act, upon certification by the office of cultural affairs
7 that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the
8 following amounts are appropriated to the office of cultural
9 affairs for the following purposes:

10 A. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to plan,
11 design, renovate, construct improvements to, equip or furnish
12 the New Mexico museum of natural history and science and its
13 annex in Bernalillo county;

14 B. one million six hundred thousand dollars
15 (\$1,600,000) to house and exhibit the Neutrogena collection in
16 Santa Fe county;

17 C. one million dollars (\$1,000,000) to plan, design,
18 construct or equip a Hispanic cultural center located in
19 Bernalillo county; and

20 D. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) for the
21 purpose of conducting a facilities plan for a new museum complex
22 in Santa Fe to include structural analysis and schematic design
23 and to develop a plan for a new museum administration building
24 for the museum of New Mexico located in Santa Fe county.

25 Section 4. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--ALBUQUERQUE TECHNICAL-

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1 VOCATIONAL INSTITUTE--PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the provisions of
2 Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the governing board
3 of Albuquerque technical-vocational institute that the need
4 exists for the issuance of the bonds, three hundred fifty
5 thousand dollars (\$350,000) is appropriated to the governing
6 board of the Albuquerque technical-vocational institute to
7 purchase and renovate Pajarito elementary school in the
8 Albuquerque public school district located in Bernalillo county.

9 Section 5. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND
10 ADMINISTRATION--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section
11 1 of this act, upon certification by the local government
12 division of the department of finance and administration that
13 the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following
14 amounts are appropriated to the local government division of the
15 department of finance and administration for the following
16 purposes:

17 A. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the purpose
18 of planning or constructing phase II of the youth sports complex
19 located in Sandoval county;

20 B. two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) to
21 design, construct or equip a recreation park located in Grant
22 county;

23 C. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for land
24 acquisition for and planning, designing, constructing, equipping
25 or furnishing a single building to serve as a community center

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1 and volunteer fire department facility in the community of
2 Chamita in Rio Arriba county;

3 D. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the purpose
4 of remodeling the Rio Arriba county courthouse in Tierra
5 Amarilla in order to comply with the federal Americans with
6 Disabilities Act of 1990;

7 E. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to
8 renovate the Las Cruces Santa Fe railroad depot in the city of
9 Las Cruces located in Dona Ana county;

10 F. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) to
11 acquire land, plan or construct a new facility for a juvenile
12 group home in San Juan county;

13 G. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) to
14 expand, renovate, improve or equip the arts and crafts
15 laboratory and classroom in the Alameda community center located
16 in Bernalillo county;

17 H. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to provide a

5 K. one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars

10 equipping phase I of a regional park and sports complex in Las

19 energy, minerals and natural resources department that the need
20 exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are
21 appropriated to the energy, minerals and natural resources
22 department for the following purposes:

23 A. eighty-three thousand dollars (\$83,000) for the
24 purpose of making capital improvements to existing facilities at
25 Red Rock state park in McKinley county in compliance with the

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1 federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; and

2 B. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the
3 purpose of making improvements to Oliver Lee state park located
4 in Otero county.

5 Section 8. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE HIGHWAY AND
6 TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions
7 of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the state
8 highway and transportation department that the need exists for
9 the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are
10 appropriated to the state highway and transportation department
