A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO REPORT ON PROVIDER RATE FEE INCREASES AND OTHER OPTIONS TO ENSURE ADEQUATE SERVICE OF MEDICALD PATIENTS THROUGHOUT NEW MEXICO.

WHEREAS, the medical d program meets critical needs by providing medical services to the poor and most disadvantaged members of the state; and

WHEREAS, the state has an ongoing interest in ensuring that medical deservices are provided in an efficient and timely manner to all eligible persons throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, problems persist in ensuring that medicaid services are reasonably available on a fair participation basis from health care providers to all eligible New Mexicans throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, health care providers have noted chronic payment problems with the amount and timing of reimbursements provided through the medicaid program, inhibiting participation by providers; and

WHEREAS, the 1995 New Mexico state legislature appropriated four million dollars (\$4,000,000) to the human services department to increase reimbursement rate fees for medicaid providers, to increase payments as a modifier add-on to physicians serving medicaid patients in medically underserved areas and to increase reimbursement rate fees for dentists participating in the medicaid program; and

WHEREAS, the governor vetoed language directing that the four million dollars (\$4,000,000) appropriated in 1995 by the New Mexico state legislature to the human services department be used specifically to increase reimbursement rate fees for medicaid providers, to provide for increased payments as a modifier add-on to physicians serving medicaid patients in medically underserved areas and to increase reimbursements to dentists in the medicaid program; and

WHEREAS, the effect of the governor's veto was to appropriate four million dollars (\$4,000,000) to the human services department for medicaid providers, without restriction; and

WHEREAS, the human services department testified before the 1995 legislative interim health care task force that it planned

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to implement a dental fee increase effective October 1995 and a physician fee increase effective January 1996, pending expenditure trends; and

WHEREAS, if voluntary efforts and fee increases to providers do not result in ensuring that medicaid services are reasonably available to all eligible New Mexicans throughout the state, then mandatory measures such as requiring medicaid services by providers as a condition of licensure may be necessary;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the human services department report to the appropriate interim legislative committee by October 1, 1996 on the effect of increased reimbursement rate fees for dentists and physicians on recruiting and maintaining more providers for the medicaid program and on the need for mandatory programs or other options to increase participation by health care providers in the medicaid program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be sent to the secretary of human services.
