A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THAT THE CORRECTIONS DEPARTMENT ADOPT PROCEDURES AND REGULATIONS TO ENSURE THAT VIOLENT FELONS SERVE A SUBSTANTIAL PORTION OF THEIR SENTENCES.

WHEREAS, during the 1995 legislative session, the legislature enacted House Judiciary Committee Substitute for House Bills 30, 169, 202 and 640, as amended, which provided that violent felony offenders would be required to serve greater proportions of their sentences and that the most violent felons would be required to serve not less than eighty-five percent of their sentences; and

WHEREAS, the governor elected to veto House Judiciary Committee Substitute for House Bills 30, 169, 202 and 640, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the public safety concerns of the citizens of New Mexico would have been addressed in part by the legislative proposal to require violent felons to serve a greater proportion of their sentences; and

WHEREAS, the federal Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 provides funding for construction of state prisons to states that give assurances that they have implemented or will implement policies to ensure that violent offenders serve a substantial

portion of the sentences imposed upon them; and

WHEREAS, in light of the governor's veto of House Judiciary Committee Substitute for House Bills 30, 169, 202 and 640, as amended, the state's eligibility for federal money to fund construction of new prisons is in doubt at a time when the state is proceeding with plans to construct two new prisons in Guadalupe and Lea counties, respectively;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE

OF NEW MEXICO that the corrections department adopt procedures and regulations to ensure
that violent felons serve a substantial portion of their sentences; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the corrections department provide testimony to an interim committee with jurisdiction over corrections issues regarding adoption of the aforementioned procedures and regulations no later than October 31, 1996; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be transmitted to the governor, the secretary of corrections and the secretary of finance and administration.
