A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THAT THE HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE CHILDREN, YOUTH AND FAMILIES DEPARTMENT, REPORT ON ISSUES CONCERNING THE MEDICALD MANAGED CARE PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the human services department implemented the primary care network in 1991 as an initial managed care delivery system to control, in part, the cost of health services for Medicaid recipients; and

WHEREAS, under the primary care network program, medicaid recipients receive routine health care services from a selected primary care provider who manages the provision of specialist services, inpatient and outpatient hospital services and most ambulatory services for medicaid recipients; and

WHEREAS, in 1994, the state legislature mandated the use of a managed care system for delivery of services to Medicaid recipients by 1995 to help improve program efficiency and access to care for low-income populations by managing the beneficiaries' care and ensuring that services are integrated and coordinated to promote early intervention and preventive care; and

WHEREAS, while statewide implementation of the primary care network may meet the legislative mandate for the use of a managed care system for medicaid recipients, the human services department determined that additional managed care delivery services should be developed and implemented for the medicaid population; and

WHEREAS, the human services department hired the health care consulting firm of Lewin-VFI, Inc. to serve as the managed care consultant to assist the department in the development of a managed care delivery system for the medicaid population; and

WHEREAS, recommendations outlined by the human services department state that the majority of services furnished to medicaid recipients will be provided in a managed care environment, the majority of medicaid eligible recipients will be required to enroll in a health maintenance organization or managed care system and the development of managed care models for additional services will be determined by a collaborative effort between the appropriate state executive agency

departments, provider groups, advocacy groups and medicaid recipients;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the human services department, in conjunction with the department of health and the children, youth and families department report to the appropriate interim legislative health care committee by September 1, 1996 on the status of the medicaid managed care planning process to include the following issues concerning the implementation of that planning process:

- A. the extent to which integrated networks of appropriately trained, high quality direct service providers are available throughout the state, including whether the managed care program demonstrates a decline in the use of specialist services and emergency rooms as service sites and whether managed care increases or decreases the number of physician visits or the use of inpatient hospital care;
- B. the extent to which an information system has been established to track all health system encounters that will enhance integration and coordination of services while protecting individual patient confidentiality;
- C. the ability of the human services department to track and adjust the performance of provider networks within the managed care system to assure comprehensive, continuous health care services, appropriate access to needed levels of care,

protection of programs for vulnerable populations and prompt medical decisions within a utilization review framework;

- the scope and effectiveness of a quality assurance program that promotes public accountability and assesses the impact of the medicaid managed care program on the quality of health care delivered;
- the financial stability of the medicaid managed Ε. care program, including the impact of the program on health care costs relative to traditional fee-for-service programs;
- F. the extent to which consumers are fully informed concerning their ability to utilize and access services under a managed care program as well as the ability of consumers to pursue grievances;
- the extent to which communities participate in G. the design and implementation of local integrated networks within the managed care program regarding local health care needs:
- H. the extent to which health promotion and disease prevention strategies have been developed and implemented;
- the extent to which performance standards that emphasize recognized health outcomes, service delivery and consumer satisfaction regarding overall care provided through a managed care program, such as the extent to which choice in physician and potential lack of use of health care services have been developed and utilized in contracts entered into with a
