A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE NEW MEXICO HEALTH POLICY COMMISSION, IN

COOPERATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, THE HUMAN SERVICES

DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF INSURANCE, TO STUDY AND PROPOSE

OPTIONS TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE BY BETTER USE OF PUBLIC

AND PRIVATE FUNDS.

WHEREAS, Section 9-7-11.1 NMSA 1978 states that it is the policy of the state of New Mexico to promote optimal health, to improve the quality of life and to assure that basic health services are available, accessible, acceptable and culturally appropriate, regardless of financial status; and

WHEREAS, although New Mexico has made progress to decrease the number of uninsured residents, the rate of New Mexico's uninsured residents still averages approximately twenty percent;

WHEREAS, New Mexico is reportedly still among the three states in the country with the highest percentage of uninsured residents; and

WHEREAS, two-thirds of uninsured New Mexicans are working people and their families; and

WHEREAS, children in New Mexico under age eighteen comprise thirty-six percent of the state's uninsured; and

WHEREAS, despite the New Mexico legislature's expansion of medicaid eligibility for children at up to one hundred eightyfive percent of the federal poverty level and the creation of the New Mexico health insurance alliance, the uninsured rate in New Mexico still remains high; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico's health care delivery system is considered a regional system in that the natural delivery areas cross county and municipality boundaries; and

WHEREAS, pending constraints in federal funding and potential federal block granting of the welfare and medicaid programs, combined with the current decline in predicted state revenues, warrant a reassessment of how the state can best expand access to health care for New Mexicans and decrease the uninsured rate; and

WHEREAS, pending federal and state revenue constraints warrant a reexamination of financing health care delivery in New Mexico and studying how the state can continue to decrease the

number of uninsured New Mexicans and obtain the best value for existing health care funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico health policy commission, in cooperation with the department of health, the human services department and the department of insurance, study and propose options to improve access to comprehensive health care by better use of existing public and private funds. The options shall include a study of:

A. what financial resources are utilized from federal, state and local governments to provide health care and how those resources can be realigned to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of health care financing and delivery and health-related functions:

- B. publicly funded insurance programs in the state and how restructuring the programs can increase the value of the money spent to insure the individuals participating in the programs, enhance the quality of health care delivery and improve access to health care insurance for a larger New Mexico population;
- C. the roles and responsibilities of the private sector and state and local government entities providing health care to determine the optimal administrative and operational structure to accomplish an efficient state, regional and local distribution of health care financing and services, including

providing catastrophic health care coverage;

- D. the development of mechanisms to inform the consumer on health insurance purchasing options and choices, including specifications for the consumer about cost, quality and consumer preference; and
- E. how private health care dollars can be used to leverage public health care dollars to provide more health care services for the uninsured; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Mexico health policy commission initiate the appropriate approach for public solicitation that involves advocates, health care providers and consumers in a community meeting process to seek consensus on how to guide health care spending, allocation and benefits decisions as those decisions relate to the study and proposed options to improve access to comprehensive health care by better use of existing public and private funds; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Mexico health policy commission seek input in its study from the risk management division of the general services department, the public school insurance authority, the retiree health care authority, the New Mexico association of counties, the New Mexico municipal league and the private sector; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Mexico health policy commission report and make recommendations to the appropriate interim legislative committee by October 15, 1996 on a new

health care financing system for New Mexico to continue to improve access to health care by better use of existing public and private funds; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be sent to the executive director of the New Mexico health policy commission, the secretary of health, the secretary of human services and the superintendent of insurance.
