11	REQUESTING THE STATE LAND OFFICE TO CONTINUE ITS COMPREHENSIVE
12	STUDY AND APPRAISAL REGARDING THE ACQUISITION AND MANAGEMENT OF
13	UTE MOUNTAIN OR OTHER INTERESTS IN UTE MOUNTAIN IN TAOS COUNTY,
14	NEW MEXICO.

16	WHEREAS, because New Mexico is the eighth fastest-growing
17	state in the nation in terms of population and because rural New
18	Mexico is heavily impacted by development, those unique
19	undeveloped areas that make this the "Land of Enchantment" are
20	few in number and threatened with extinction; and
21	WHEREAS, one very unique area, known as Ute mountain,
22	located deep in northern New Mexico, has valuable ground water
23	resources, wildlife habitat, scenic and recreational value and
24	significant cultural and archaeological sites; and
25	WHEREAS, one of the most valuable natural resources at Ute

<u> Underscored mterial = new</u> [bracketed mterial] = delete mountain is the ground water, which is estimated to supply twenty-five percent of the water to the Rio Grande between the Colorado line and the junction with Red river; and

WHEREAS, the pristine and pure Ute mountain ground water system is sensitive and fractured, making it very susceptible to pollution from both point and nonpoint sources that could further contaminate the water used by thousands of New Mexicans who rely upon the Rio Grande; and

WHEREAS, used annually as a wintering ground by large herds of deer and antelope and year round by raptors and many other species, the fifteen-thousand-acre Ute mountain qualifies as a true nature reserve and wilderness area with its values of naturalness and solitude; and

WHEREAS, while both remote and wild, Ute mountain has had limited but continuous human contact for several thousand years, including grazing of livestock by early indigenous peoples and hiking, fishing and rafting by modern people on the adjacent Rio Grande; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of New Mexico would benefit from the protection and preservation of Ute mountain in its natural state;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the state land office continue its efforts to conduct an assessment and study of the preservation, management and public ownership of Ute mountain, or an interest

in Ute mountain, and coordinate its activities as necessary with the property owner and any private and public sector land agencies; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of New Mexico's congressional delegation be requested to sponsor legislation authorizing the acquisition of Ute mountain for the public benefit through purchase or exchange by the bureau of land management; and
