A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF BARBERS AND COSMETOLOGISTS AND THE GOVERNOR'S COMMITTEE ON CONCERNS OF THE HANDICAPPED TO JOINTLY CONDUCT A REVIEW OF THE BARBERS AND COSMETOLOGISTS ACT AND ITS LICENSING REGULATIONS TO DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ACCOMMODATING THE HOMEBOUND.

WHEREAS, New Mexico has a sizable population of aged, homebound, handicapped and institutionalized residents who have limited access to barber and cosmetological services commonly available to the mainstream population; and

WHEREAS, the existing barber and cosmetologist licensing system prohibits delivery of mobile services to the homebound or institutionalized client; and

WHEREAS, bureau of the census data indicates that the number of people over sixty-five years of age will almost double

1 by the year 2010, and the number of individuals with mobility
2 and self-care limitations will increase accordingly;

3 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
4 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the board of barbers and cosmetologists
5 and the governor's committee on concerns of the handicapped be
6 requested to jointly conduct a review of the Barbers and
7 Cosmetologists Act and licensing regulations and be requested to
8 make recommendations to the appropriate interim committee by
9 November 1, 1996 for changes that provide for mobile services to
10 the homebound and institutionalized population; and

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be
12 transmitted to the superintendent of regulation and licensing,
13 the chairman of the governor's committee on concerns of the
14 handicapped and the board of barbers and cosmetologists.
