A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE SECRETARY OF STATE, THE COUNTY CLERKS AND THE TRIBAL ELECTION OFFICES AND TRIBAL CENSUS OFFICES TO COOPERATE IN VOTER REGISTRATION.

WHEREAS, the New Mexico association of Native American election information programs' main objective is to educate Native Americans in the election process according to the United States constitution and the constitution of New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexico association of Native American election information programs is organized to operate for the enhancement, improvement and delivery of the electoral process to Navajo chapters and the Jicarilla, Mescalero and pueblo communities; and

WHEREAS, there are many thousands of Native American men and women who are eligible to vote in New Mexico who should be

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registered in compliance with federal, state and county laws; and

WHEREAS, the right to vote is a valuable right, and it is essential that Native Americans exercise their right to vote and become educated in the electoral processes of the federal, state and local governments; and

WHEREAS, the state and tribal governments have worked jointly to enhance and strengthen the government-to-government relationship between their respective governments;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that it request the county clerks of Sandoval, McKinley, San Juan, Bernalillo, Socorro, Cibola, Santa Fe, Rio Arriba and Otero counties to network with the secretary of state, the nineteen pueblo tribes, the Navajo election administration and the Jicarilla and Mescalero Apache tribes to augment voter registration and awareness; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the secretary of state, the county clerks in the aforementioned counties and the tribal election offices and the tribal census offices cooperate in voter registration; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the aforementioned parties work cohesively to maximize voter registration and voter participation in the election process or as contained in the mission of the New Mexico association of Native American election information programs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the secretary of state for distribution to the appropriate agencies.

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
