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10	A JOINT RESOLUTION
11	PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLE 4, SECTIONS 4 AND 10 OF THE
12	CONSTITUTION OF NEW MEXICO TO LIMIT THE TERMS OF LEGISLATORS,
13	PROVIDE FOR COMPENSATION TO LEGISLATORS AND PROHIBIT CERTAIN
14	GIFTS TO LEGISLATORS.
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16	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. It is proposed to amend Article 4, Section 4 of
18	the constitution of New Mexico to read:
19	"Members of the legislature shall be elected as follows:
20	[those senators from Bernalillo, Chaves, Curry, DeBaca, Grant,
21	<del>Lea, Lincoln, Luna, Sandoval, San Juan, San Miguel, Socorro,</del>
22	Taos, Torrance, Union and Valencia counties for a term of six
23	years starting January 1, 1961, and after serving such terms
24	shall be elected for a term of four years thereafter; those
25	senators from all other counties for the terms] senators for

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terms of four years, and members of the house of representatives for [a-term] terms of two years. [They] Excluding service in the legislature prior to the first session of the forty-third legislature, or an appointment to a vacant office, no legislator shall serve more than three consecutive terms in the senate and six consecutive terms in the house of representatives. Senators and members of the house of representatives shall be elected on the day provided by law for holding the general election of state officers or representatives in congress. If a vacancy occurs in the office of senator or member of the house of representatives, for any reason, the county commissioners of the county wherein the vacancy occurs shall fill such vacancy by appointment.

Such legislative appointments as provided in this section shall be for a term ending on December 31, subsequent to the next succeeding general election."

Section 2. It is proposed to amend Article 4, Section 10 of the constitution of New Mexico to read:

"A. Each member of the legislature shall receive:

[A. as per diem expense the sum of not more than seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) for each day's attendance during each session, as provided by law, and twenty-five cents (\$.25) for each mile traveled in going to and returning from the seat of government by the usual traveled route, once each session as defined by Article 4, Section 5 of this constitution;]

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1	<u>(1) an annual salary in an amount equal to</u>
2	twenty percent of the governor's annual salary;
3	<u>(2) per diem expense for each day's attendance</u>
4	during a legislative session at the same rate as other elected
5	state officials are paid for conducting official duties away
6	<u>from their official offices;</u>
7	[ <del>B.</del> ] <u>(3)</u> per diem expense [ <del>and mileage</del> ] at the
8	same [ <del>rates</del> ] <u>rate</u> as provided in [ <del>Subsection A</del> ] <u>Paragraph (2)</u> of
9	this [ <del>section</del> ] <u>subsection</u> for service at meetings required by
10	legislative committees established by the legislature to meet in
11	the interim between sessions; and
12	(4) mileage at the internal revenue service
13	standard mileage rate for each mile traveled in going to and
14	returning from the seat of government by the usually traveled
15	<u>route, once during each session of the legislature and mileage</u>
16	<u>at that same rate for each mile traveled for service at meetings</u>
17	<u>required by legislative committees established by the</u>
18	legislature to meet in the interim between sessions.
19	[ <del>C.</del> ] <u>B. A member of the legislature shall receive</u> no
20	other compensation, perquisite or allowance.
21	<u>C. A member of the legislature shall not accept</u>
22	<u>anything of a value in excess of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)</u>
23	<u>from a lobbyist, as that term may be defined by law</u> ."
24	Section 3. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall
25	be submitted to the people for their approval or rejection at
