AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL PROJECTS; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE  
AUTHORIZATION FOR FINANCING CAPITAL PROJECTS FROM THE PUBLIC  
PROJECT REVOLVING FUND; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. AUTHORIZATION OF PROJECTS. -- Pursuant to the  
provisions of Section 6-21-6 NMSA 1978, the legislature  
authorizes the New Mexico finance authority to make loans from  
the public project revolving fund to the following qualified  
entities for the following public projects on terms and  
conditions established by the authority:

A. to the city of Aztec for a water project and a  
wastewater project;

B. to Santa Fe county for a recreational facility

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1 project, a parking facility project, a detention facility  
2 project and a solid waste project;

3 C. to Socorro county for land acquisition for an  
4 administration building project;

5 D. to the Hyde Park community water association for  
6 a water project;

7 E. to the Lea county solid waste authority for a  
8 solid waste project;

9 F. to McKinley county for a public health clinic  
10 project;

11 G. to the Ruidoso regional joint use board for a  
12 wastewater project;

13 H. to the village of Cloudcroft for a water project  
14 and a wastewater project;

15 I. to Valencia county for a solid waste project;

16 J. to the Alpine Village sanitation district for a  
17 water project;

18 K. to the city of Aztec for an electric utility  
19 distribution system project;

20 L. to the village of Columbus for a fire station  
21 project and a solid waste project;

22 M. to the Garfield water association for a water  
23 project;

24 N. to the village of Angel Fire for a solid waste  
25 project;

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- 1           O. to the city of Raton for a solid waste project;
- 2           P. to the village of Roy for a solid waste project;
- 3           Q. to the town of Taos for a solid waste project;
- 4           R. to Mora county for a solid waste project;
- 5           S. to the town of Taos for a water rights
- 6 acquisition project;
- 7           T. to the Nor-Lea county hospital for a medical
- 8 building project;
- 9           U. to the Agua Santa water association for a water
- 10 project;
- 11          V. to the Dona Ana county flood control commission
- 12 for a flood control project;
- 13          W. to the energy, minerals and natural resources
- 14 department for park system capital projects;
- 15          X. to Valencia and Socorro counties for a central
- 16 solid waste authority;
- 17          Y. to the town of Hagerman to purchase water rights;
- 18          Z. to San Juan county for a water treatment plant at
- 19 the Navajo agriculture products industry location on the Navajo
- 20 nation;
- 21          AA. to New Mexico state university for a center for
- 22 sustainable development of arid lands;
- 23          BB. to the city of Rio Rancho for a youth complex;
- 24 and
- 25          CC. to the city of Clovis for a solid waste project.

1           Section 2. AUTHORIZATION TO ISSUE BONDS-- APPROPRIATIONS. --

2 Pursuant to the provisions of the New Mexico Finance Authority  
3 Act, the New Mexico finance authority may issue and sell revenue  
4 bonds payable from the public project revolving fund in an  
5 amount not to exceed ten million three hundred fifty-seven  
6 thousand dollars (\$10,357,000), the proceeds of which are  
7 appropriated in the following amounts to the following agencies  
8 for the following purposes:

9           A. six million eight hundred thousand dollars  
10 (\$6,800,000) to the taxation and revenue department to purchase  
11 and install the taxation and revenue information management  
12 system;

13           B. two hundred twenty thousand seven hundred dollars  
14 (\$220,700) to the general services department to purchase and  
15 install a requisition processing system;

16           C. four hundred ten thousand five hundred dollars  
17 (\$410,500) to the public defender department to purchase and  
18 install office automation and case tracking systems;

19           D. seven hundred eighteen thousand dollars  
20 (\$718,000) to the state treasurer to develop, purchase and  
21 install the treasurer's warrant account reconciliation  
22 accounting system;

23           E. three hundred seven thousand eight hundred  
24 dollars (\$307,800) to the regulation and licensing department to  
25 purchase and install computer system improvements;

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1           F. four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) to the  
2 office of the state engineer to purchase equipment to conduct a  
3 comprehensive information system pilot project for water rights  
4 and hydrological studies;

5           G. two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) to  
6 the human services department to purchase and install an  
7 information system for the income support division system;

8           H. six hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$650,000) to  
9 the department of health to develop, purchase and install a  
10 system for the community provider payment project; and

11           I. six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) to the  
12 corrections department to purchase and install the inmate  
13 management information system.

14           Section 3. CERTIFICATION.--The New Mexico finance  
15 authority shall require periodic certification from the agencies  
16 identified in Section 2 of this act and from the department of  
17 finance and administration that the approved project is on  
18 schedule and that all funds have been properly expended for the  
19 project. A copy of the certification and all supporting  
20 documentation shall be submitted to the legislative finance  
21 committee.

22           Section 4. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public  
23 peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
