MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO NEW MEXICO STATE UNIVERSITY FOR A  
NATIVE AMERICAN STUDENT RETENTION PROJECT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. APPROPRIATION. -- One hundred thousand dollars  
(\$100,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the board of  
regents of New Mexico state university for expenditure in fiscal  
year 1998 for the purpose of establishing a Native American  
student retention project that is comprised of components in  
counseling, tutoring, assessment, expansion of orientation  
programs, mentoring and general educational support. Any  
unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of  
fiscal year 1998 shall revert to the general fund.
