RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS; REAUTHORIZING UNEXPENDED OR UNENCUMBERED BALANCES; CHANGING THE PURPOSE OF CERTAIN BOND AUTHORIZATIONS; EXTENDING THE EXPENDITURE PERIODS; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS-- AUTHORIZATIONS--
APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS. --

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts authorized for purposes specified in this act. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner

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1 possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been
2 developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the
3 project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The
4 state board of finance shall further take the appropriate
5 steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of
6 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are
7 appropriated for the purposes specified in this act.

8 B. The agencies named in this act shall certify to
9 the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of
10 the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed
11 for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this
12 act.

13 C. If the specified agency has not certified the
14 need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year
15 2000, the authorization provided in this act shall be void.

16 D. Unless otherwise specified in this act, any
17 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the proceeds
18 of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to this act at the end
19 of fiscal year 2002 shall revert to the severance tax bonding
20 fund.

21 Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--GENERAL SERVICES
22 DEPARTMENT--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
23 of this act, upon certification by the property control
24 division of the general services department that the need
25 exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts

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1 are appropriated to the capital program fund for the following
2 purposes:

3 A. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for
4 roof replacement and related repairs to state buildings
5 located throughout the state; and

6 B. two million five hundred thousand dollars
7 (\$2,500,000) to plan, design and make improvements to
8 buildings located throughout the state, including necessary
9 improvements to comply with the Americans With Disabilities
10 Act of 1990.

11 Section 3. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF
12 ENVIRONMENT--PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
13 of this act, upon certification by the department of
14 environment that the need exists for the issuance of the
15 bonds, one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000)
16 is appropriated to the wastewater facility construction loan
17 fund to carry out the provisions of the Wastewater Facility
18 Construction Loan Act.

19 Section 4. EMPLOYMENT SECURITY DEPARTMENT FUND--CAPITAL
20 PROGRAM FUND--PURPOSES.--

21 A. Six hundred six thousand six hundred dollars
22 (\$606,600) is appropriated from the employment security
23 department fund to the capital program fund for expenditure in
24 fiscal years 1998 through 2000 for the following purposes at
25 the labor department:

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1 (1) three hundred ninety-one thousand four
2 hundred dollars (\$391,400) to renovate and make improvements
3 to the Tiwa building in Bernalillo county;

4 (2) one hundred fifty-five thousand eight
5 hundred dollars (\$155,800) to renovate the mechanical systems
6 at the Tiwa building in Bernalillo county; and

7 (3) fifty-nine thousand four hundred dollars
8 (\$59,400) for roof replacement and related repairs at the
9 Hobbs office building in Lea county.

10 B. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance
11 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the
12 employment security department fund.

13 Section 5. MINERS' TRUST FUND--PURPOSES. --

14 A. Four hundred seventy-four thousand six hundred
15 dollars (\$474,600) is appropriated from the miners' trust fund
16 to the miners' Colfax medical center in the following amounts
17 for the following purposes for expenditure in fiscal years
18 1998 and 1999:

19 (1) twenty-six thousand dollars (\$26,000) to
20 purchase an endoscope cleaning system;

21 (2) thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) to
22 construct a walkway between buildings;

23 (3) seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000)
24 to improve the information system;

25 (4) eighty-one thousand dollars (\$81,000) to

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1 refurnish and equip the laboratory; and
2 (5) two hundred fifty-seven thousand six
3 hundred dollars (\$257,600) to renovate the quarters' building.

4 B. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance
5 remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the
6 miners' trust fund.

7 Section 6. GENERAL FUND-- EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY FUND--
8 PURPOSE. --Six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) is
9 appropriated from the general fund to the educational
10 technology fund for expenditure in fiscal year 1998 and
11 subsequent fiscal years for the purpose of implementing the
12 provisions of the Technology for Education Act. Any
13 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of any
14 fiscal year shall not revert.

15 Section 7. REAUTHORIZATION-- GENERAL SERVICES
16 DEPARTMENT-- EXTENDING EXPENDITURE PERIOD-- CHANGE IN PURPOSE. --
17 Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection D of Section 1 of
18 Chapter 148 of Laws 1994, the balance of the proceeds from the
19 sale of severance tax bonds appropriated to the general
20 services department pursuant to Subsection D of Section 13 of
21 Chapter 148 of Laws 1994 to construct, furnish and equip a
22 visitor, control and administrative center and improve
23 security at the New Mexico boys' school at Springer located in
24 Colfax county shall not be expended for its original purpose
25 but is reauthorized and appropriated to the property control

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1 division of the general services department to repair,
2 renovate and make improvements at the New Mexico boys' school
3 at Springer located in Colfax county. The period of time in
4 which this appropriation may be expended is extended through
5 fiscal year 2001. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance
6 remaining from the proceeds of the bonds at the end of fiscal
7 year 2001 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

8 Section 8. PROJECT SCOPE--EXPENDITURES.--If an
9 appropriation for a project authorized in this act is not
10 sufficient to complete all the purposes specified, the
11 appropriation may be expended for any portion of the purposes
12 specified in the appropriation. Expenditures shall not be
13 made for purposes other than those specified in the
14 appropriation.

15 Section 9. ART IN PUBLIC PLACES.--Pursuant to Section
16 13-4A-4 NMSA 1978 and where applicable, the appropriations
17 authorized in this act include one percent for the art in
18 public places fund.

19 Section 10. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public
20 peace, health and safety that this act take effect
21 immediately.

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS; REAUTHORIZING UNEXPENDED OR UNENCUMBERED BALANCES; CHANGING AGENCIES AND PURPOSES OF CERTAIN BOND AUTHORIZATIONS AND FUND APPROPRIATIONS; EXTENDING EXPENDITURE PERIODS; AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS-- AUTHORIZATIONS--
APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS. --

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts authorized for purposes specified in this act. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the

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1 project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The
2 state board of finance shall further take the appropriate
3 steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of
4 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are
5 appropriated for the purposes specified in this act.

6 B. The agencies named in this act shall certify to
7 the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of
8 the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed
9 for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this
10 act.

11 C. If the specified agency has not certified the
12 need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year
13 2000, the authorization provided in this act shall be void.

14 D. Unless otherwise specified in this act, any
15 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the proceeds
16 of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to this act at the end
17 of fiscal year 2002 shall revert to the severance tax bonding
18 fund.

19 Section 2. STATE AGENCY ON AGING--PURPOSES. --Pursuant to
20 the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by
21 the state agency on aging that the need exists for the
22 issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated
23 to the state agency on aging for the following purposes:

24 A. one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars
25 (\$175,000) to construct new activity rooms at the Deming-Luna
senior citizen center in Luna county;

B. two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars
(\$225,000) to plan, design or construct a senior citizen

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1 center in Mexican Springs in McKinley county;

2 C. eighty-four thousand dollars (\$84,000) for an
3 addition at the Nageezi senior center in McKinley county;

4 D. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to plan, design,
5 construct and equip a senior citizen center in the community of
6 Truchas in Rio Arriba county;

7 E. eight thousand eight hundred dollars (\$8,800) to
8 renovate and make improvements to the Floyd senior citizen center
9 in Roosevelt county;

10 F. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to complete
11 the addition at the senior citizen center and for purchase of
12 equipment and furnishings in Two Grey Hills in San Juan county;

13 G. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for phase one
14 construction of the Jemez pueblo elderly center in Sandoval
15 county; and

16 H. one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars
17 (\$175,000) to repair, renovate or remodel the senior citizen
18 center in Truth or Consequences in Sierra county.

19 Section 3. OFFICE OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS--PURPOSES. --Pursuant
20 to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by
21 the office of cultural affairs that the need exists for the
22 issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to
23 the office of cultural affairs for the following purposes:

24 A. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for
25 additions to and remodeling of the museum of natural history,
including relocation and expansion of the theater, a new
ticketing pavilion, exterior improvements and completion of
permanent exhibition halls, in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

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1 B. one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for installation
2 of permanent exhibits and an automated ticketing system at the
3 New Mexico farm and ranch heritage museum in Dona Ana county;

4 C. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for
5 renovation and improvements at the New Mexico museum of natural
6 history and science and the museum annex located in Bernalillo
7 county;

8 D. one hundred thirty-five thousand dollars
9 (\$135,000) to purchase a bookmobile to be based in Tucumcari
10 located in Quay county;

11 E. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to plan an
12 addition to and provide for the preservation of the Fort Selden
13 ruins and to procure exhibits honoring the Buffalo soldiers in
14 Dona Ana county;

15 F. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for
16 reroofing the Clyde Tombaugh space theater and planetarium in
17 Alamogordo in Otero county;

18 G. four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) for the
19 planning phase for a history museum in Santa Fe county; and

20 H. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to plan, design
21 and renovate the museo cultural in Santa Fe in Santa Fe county.

22 Section 4. CUMBRES AND TOLTEC SCENIC RAILROAD COMMISSION--
23 PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act,
24 upon certification by the Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad
25 commission that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds,
the following amounts are appropriated to the Cumbres and Toltec
scenic railroad commission for the following purposes:

 A. eight thousand one hundred dollars (\$8,100) to

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1 renovate, in order to comply with the requirements of the
2 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the Antonito depot of
3 the Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad;

4 B. forty-eight thousand six hundred dollars (\$48,600)
5 to renovate, in order to comply with the requirements of the
6 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the Chama engine house
7 at the Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad in Rio Arriba county;

8 C. eleven thousand six hundred dollars (\$11,600) to
9 renovate, in order to comply with the requirements of the
10 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the Osier facility at
11 the Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad;

12 D. fifty-six thousand dollars (\$56,000) to construct
13 an addition and other improvements to the car shop and engine
14 house at the Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad in Rio Arriba
15 county in order to comply with the Americans with Disabilities
16 Act of 1990; and

17 E. fifteen thousand four hundred dollars (\$15,400) to
18 renovate, in order to comply with the requirements of the
19 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the commission office of
20 the Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad in Rio Arriba county.

21 Section 5. OFFICE OF THE STATE ENGINEER--PURPOSES.--

22 Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon
23 certification by the office of the state engineer that the need
24 exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are
25 appropriated to the office of the state engineer for the
following purposes:

A. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for a
water modeling project for the Eldorado water and sanitation

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1 district in Santa Fe county;

2 B. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for repairs and
3 improvements in the Antelope Valley irrigation district in Colfax
4 county; and

5 C. one million seven hundred fifty thousand dollars
6 (\$1,750,000) to develop a state water plan and provide regional
7 planning grants throughout the state.

8 Section 6. ENERGY, MINERALS AND NATURAL RESOURCES

9 DEPARTMENT--PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of
10 this act, upon certification by the energy, minerals and natural
11 resources department that the need exists for the issuance of the
12 bonds, five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is appropriated
13 to the energy, minerals and natural resources department to
14 renovate and provide storage facilities at forestry headquarters
15 and other facilities located throughout the state.

16 Section 7. DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT--PURPOSES.--Pursuant
17 to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by
18 the department of environment that the need exists for the
19 issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to
20 the department of environment for the following purposes:

21 A. forty-three thousand dollars (\$43,000) for water
22 system improvements in Los Ranchos de Albuquerque in Bernalillo
23 county;

24 B. three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) to
25 continue construction of sewer projects in the north valley area
of Bernalillo county. The certification and issuance of bonds is
contingent upon the city of Albuquerque, Bernalillo county and
the village of Los Ranchos de Albuquerque entering into an

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1 agreement regarding planning, designing and constructing sewer
2 collection and treatment facilities in the north valley area of
3 Bernalillo county;

4 C. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for phase two of
5 a water and wastewater improvement, expansion and replacement
6 project in Angel Fire in Colfax county;

7 D. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for water and
8 sewer infrastructure improvement projects in Maxwell in Colfax
9 county;

10 E. sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) to design,
11 inspect and construct water system improvements in the Mountain
12 View community of southern Dona Ana county;

13 F. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to construct an
14 extension of a water line to serve residents of Watson lane in
15 Dona Ana county;

16 G. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to plan,
17 design, construct and equip the phase two wastewater effluent
18 reuse facility in Carlsbad in Eddy county;

19 H. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to complete
20 phases two and three improvements to the Malaga community
21 domestic water system in Eddy county;

22 I. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to improve
23 the Lone Mountain and Twin Sisters wellfields in Santa Clara in
24 Grant county;

25 J. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for an
eastside wastewater facility replacement and improvement project
in Santa Rosa in Guadalupe county;

K. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to expand

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1 the Milan sewer system in Cibola county;

2 L. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to improve
3 the water and sanitation sewer disposal system in Thoreau in
4 McKinley county;

5 M twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for water
6 line extensions, meters, a well house and an office and storage
7 building for the Buena Vista mutual water consumers association
8 in Mora county;

9 N. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to plan,
10 design and construct lagoons and install sewer extensions in
11 Abiquiu in Rio Arriba county;

12 O. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for
13 renovating, expanding and upgrading the Velarde mutual domestic
14 water users association water system in Rio Arriba county;

15 P. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for phase
16 three of the construction and improvement of the Agua Sana
17 regional water system in Rio Arriba county;

18 Q. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for
19 improvements to the Canjilon water system in Rio Arriba county;

20 R. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to extend
21 and replace water lines and to design, construct, install and
22 equip improvements to the water system of the Cebolla mutual
23 domestic water consumers association in Rio Arriba county;

24 S. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to upgrade
25 the water system in Regina located in Sandoval county, including
expanding the storage and distribution system;

T. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to upgrade
and repair the Ensenada community water system in Rio Arriba

1 county;

2 U. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to complete
3 community water system repairs in Gallina in Rio Arriba county;

4 V. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the
5 planning, designing and installing of a wastewater treatment
6 facility in Jemez Springs in Sandoval county;

7 W. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to design,
8 construct and equip improvements to, and purchase water rights
9 for, the water system of the Ponderosa mutual domestic water
10 consumers association in Sandoval county;

11 X. one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars
12 (\$175,000) for planning, designing and constructing of
13 replacement and improvements to the water distribution system,
14 including individual home metering, in the Rancho West mobile
15 home association in Rio Rancho in Sandoval county;

16 Y. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to plan and
17 design a sewer system for San Ysidro in Sandoval county;

18 Z. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to purchase and
19 install a water storage tank and appurtenances in the El Prado
20 water and sanitation district in Taos county;

21 AA. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to plan,
22 design and install a community water system in El Rito in Taos
23 county;

24 BB. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) for land
25 acquisition, well development, a water delivery system and a
26 storage tank in Estancia in Torrance county; and

27 CC. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
28 design, construct and inspect water system improvements in

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1 Clayton in Union county.

2 Section 8. STATE FAIR COMMISSION--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to
3 the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by
4 the state fair commission that the need exists for the issuance
5 of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the state
6 fair commission for the following purposes:

7 A. one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for site drainage
8 improvements at the New Mexico state fairgrounds in Bernalillo
9 county; and

10 B. eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000) for
11 renovations and improvements to various facilities located at the
12 New Mexico state fairgrounds in Bernalillo county.

13 Section 9. DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION--
14 PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act,
15 upon certification by the local government division of the
16 department of finance and administration that the need exists for
17 the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated
18 to the local government division of the department of finance and
19 administration for the following purposes:

20 A. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to purchase
21 computers and other equipment for the county of Bernalillo to use
22 for an organization located in the southeast area of Albuquerque
23 that provides residential community-based reintegration services
24 for criminal offenders who are making a transition back into
25 society;

26 B. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to design
27 and construct Alamosa center park in Albuquerque in Bernalillo
28 county;

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1 C. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to
2 renovate the Arroyo del Oso park in Albuquerque in Bernalillo
3 county;

4 D. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to design and
5 construct improvements at the Alameda little league complex at
6 the balloon fiesta park in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

7 E. three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) to
8 acquire, develop and construct improvements to a three-acre Bel
9 Air area park on Phoenix in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

10 F. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) to
11 continue construction of a preschool at the Dennis Chavez
12 community center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

13 G. one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars
14 (\$175,000) to construct storage, restroom, concession and
15 security observation facilities at the athletic fields in the
16 East Mountain area of Bernalillo county;

17 H. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to acquire
18 computer hardware and software for the Alameda community center
19 in Bernalillo county;

20 I. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to design and
21 develop the east Atrisco park in Albuquerque in Bernalillo
22 county;

23 J. three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) to
24 acquire land for, plan, renovate or construct Bataan park in
25 Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

K. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to
complete the master plan improvements to the site and the
interior, equip and furnish the holiday shelter center in

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1 Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

2 L. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
3 complete construction of a gymnasium at the Kinney Brick
4 community center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

5 M. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for phase
6 one planning, designing and construction of a multipurpose
7 service center in the Atrisco-Five Points area of the south
8 valley in Bernalillo county;

9 N. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to design
10 and renovate Kiva park in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

11 O. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to acquire land
12 for baseball fields in or near Paradise Hills in Bernalillo
13 county;

14 P. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to plan, design,
15 develop and make improvements, including site preparation, to
16 Parkway park located south of Ladera boulevard and west of Unser
17 boulevard in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

18 Q. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to plan, design,
19 develop and make improvements, including site preparation, to

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5 school in Santa Fe county pursuant to Subsection HH of Section
6 13 of Chapter 7 of Laws 1998 shall be expanded, and the proceeds
7 are appropriated to include making any improvements to the
8 Pojoaque valley schools in Santa Fe county. ".
