## FOR THE LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION STUDY COMMITTEE

#### AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION; ENACTING THE STRATEGIC PLANNING
COORDINATING COUNCIL ACT; CREATING THE STRATEGIC PLANNING
COORDINATING COUNCIL; PROVIDING DUTIES; PROVIDING STAFF;
MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SHORT TITLE.--This act may be cited as the "Strategic Planning Coordinating Council Act".

### Section 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE. --

A. The legislature finds that it is important to provide the highest quality elementary and secondary education in New Mexico to develop in students the knowledge and skills necessary for responsible citizenship, productive employment and satisfying lives.

B. The legislature finds that the mission of

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public education is best accomplished by implementing the objectives and achieving the goals outlined in the strategic plan.

- C. The legislature finds that involving all branches of government and the public in the educational process will achieve widespread understanding of and support for the strategic plan.
- D. It is the purpose of the Strategic Planning
  Coordinating Council Act to establish a process to ensure the
  continuous enhancement and implementation of the strategic
  plan pursuant to the Strategic Planning for Public Education
  Act by:
- (1) evaluating results, including the annual assessment, review and revision of the strategic plan;
- (2) integrating the school districts' current budget activities by using both the budget cycle and educational plan for student success to implement the strategic plan; and
- (3) encouraging the three branches of government and the public to work together toward New Mexico's mission of public education.
- Section 3. DEFINITIONS. -- As used in the Strategic Planning Coordinating Council Act:
- $\label{eq:A. Council means the strategic planning} A. \quad \text{"council" means the strategic planning coordinating council; and}$

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B. "strategic plan" means the New Mexico public education strategic plan developed pursuant to the Strategic Planning for Public Education Act.

Section 4. STRATEGIC PLAN. -- The strategic plan shall provide:

A. a well-defined vision and articulated steps to achieve national preeminence in education;

- B. a means to gain statewide consensus by encouraging the legislature, the governor's office, related state agencies, the state board of education, the state department of public education, the local school boards, school personnel, parents, students, the business community and school districts to work together toward the common goal of improving educational opportunities and performance of all the children of New Mexico; and
- C. coordination of the state-level planning cycle with the budgeting cycle.
  - Section 5. STRATEGIC PLANNING COORDINATING COUNCIL. --
- A. The "strategic planning coordinating council" is created.
- B. The council shall be composed of fifteen members. The members shall be representative of the different geographical areas of the state and reflective of the diverse population of the state.
- C. The president pro tempore of the senate shall . 120205.1

appoint two members from the senate and the speaker of the house shall appoint two members from the house of representatives for terms of two years or less to coincide with their terms of office.

- D. Eleven members shall be appointed as follows:
- (1) the president of the state board of education shall appoint one member for a two-year term and one member for a four-year term;
- (2) the governor shall appoint two members for two-year terms and one member for a four-year term; and
- (3) the governor, the speaker of the house, the president pro tempore of the senate and the president of the state board of education shall jointly appoint three members for two-year terms and three members for four-year terms.
- E. After the initial appointments, members who are not legislators shall be appointed for four-year terms, and members who are legislators shall be appointed for terms of two years or less to coincide with their terms of office.
- F. Members of the council, except for members who are legislators, may be reimbursed as provided in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance.
  - Section 6. DUTIES. -- The council shall:
- A. make recommendations to the legislature, the . 120205.1

governor and the state board of education for the enhancement and implementation of the strategic plan and for the development of the priorities to be implemented yearly;

- B. make recommendations to the legislature, the governor and the state board of education for the development of a variety of formal and informal mechanisms to involve the public in this process;
- C. review the planning efforts conducted by the school districts and make recommendations to the legislature, the governor and the state board of education on the evaluation and revision of the strategic plan in response to public input;
- D. direct staff in the development of recommendations of proposed revisions of the strategic plan;
- E. submit the revised strategic plan to the legislative education study committee, the office of the governor and the state board of education with an analysis of the new priorities, including cost of implementation, recommendations regarding necessary legislation for implementation of the goals and objectives of the strategic plan and a recommended annual budget for the council's activities; and
- F. report at least annually to the legislature, the governor, the state board of education and the public on the progress in achieving and implementing the goals and

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objectives of the strategic plan.

Section 7. STAFF MANAGEMENT TEAM-DUTIES.--The council shall be staffed by a staff management team composed of three staff members. The director of the legislative education study committee staff, the superintendent of public instruction and the office of the governor shall each designate a staff member to work with the council. The staff shall assist the council in carrying out its duties and shall serve as liaison to their appointing agencies.

Section 8. ADMINISTRATION. -- The legislative education study committee, in cooperation with the state board of education and the governor's office, shall be the administrative agency for the council. The legislative education study committee, in consultation with the state board of education and the governor's office, may contract for strategic planning assistance.

Section 9. APPROPRIATION. -- Seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the state department of public education for expenditure in fiscal years 1998 and 1999 for the purpose of funding personnel for the staff management team of the strategic planning coordinating council. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 10. APPROPRIATION. -- Seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the .120205.1

department of finance and administration for expenditure in fiscal years 1998 and 1999 for the purpose of funding personnel for the staff management team of the strategic planning coordinating council. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 11. APPROPRIATION. -- Eighty-two thousand dollars

Section 11. APPROPRIATION. -- Eighty-two thousand dollars (\$82,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the legislative education study committee for expenditure in fiscal years 1998 and 1999 for the purpose of funding personnel for the staff management team of the strategic planning coordinating council and for the purpose of paying per diem and travel expenses for members of the strategic planning coordinating council. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 12. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
