16	A. Six million six hundred forty-two thousand
17	seven hundred fifty-six dollars (\$6,642,756) is appropriated
18	from the general fund to the state agency on aging for
19	expenditure in fiscal year 1999 for the following purposes and
20	in the following amounts:
21	(1) five million four hundred twenty-three
22	thousand nine hundred one dollars (\$5,423,901) to the six area
23	agencies on aging for senior services, including case
24	management, respite care, Alzheimer's respite care, adult
25	daycare, congregate meals, home delivered meals,
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1 transportation and in-home services; 2 (2)six hundred seventy-four thousand two 3 hundred thirty-three dollars (\$674,233) to provide increased volunteer positions for the foster grandparent, senior 4 5 companion and RSVP programs; eighty-seven thousand two hundred 6 (3) 7 seventy-two dollars (\$87,272) for increased information and 8 assistance and consultation and education services for 9 individuals with Alzheimer's disease or related disorders and 10 their families or caregivers; 11 (4) twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) 12 for statewide senior citizen olympics activities; 13 (5) two hundred twenty-six thousand one hundred dollars (\$226,100) for statewide long-term care 14 ombudsman services: and 15 two hundred six thousand two hundred 16 (6) fifty dollars (\$206,250) for increased health insurance and 17 18 public benefits counseling efforts using peer counselors, 19 especially to assist older individuals to access the medicaid 20 managed care system. 21 Β. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the 22 23 general fund. 24 - 2 -25
