Section 1. A new section of the Real Estate Appraisers
Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] APPRAISAL MANAGEMENT COMPANIES-REGISTRATION--EMPLOYMENT OF LEGALLY QUALIFIED APPRAISER. --

A. For the purpose of this section, "appraisal management company" means a person that acts as an intermediary for mortgage lending institutions to recruit and hire appraisers to perform real estate appraisals or appraisal reviews and to transmit the appraisals, appraisal reviews,

final value estimates or certificates of value to lending institutions to be used in the making of mortgage loans. An appraisal management company insures, guarantees, indemnifies or by similar means protects the mortgage lender from improper, inaccurate or fraudulent appraisals.

- B. An appraisal management company doing business in New Mexico must be registered with the board. An appraisal management company shall conduct its business in accordance with all federal and state laws governing the appraisal of real estate.
- C. If an appraisal management company provides insurance or guaranty to users of its services, the appraisal management company shall comply with all federal and state laws governing the issuance of insurance policies and comply with the New Mexico Insurance Code and rules adopted by the superintendent of insurance in accordance with that act.
- D. When an appraisal review is conducted or required, the New Mexico-certified appraiser shall have specific geographic competency to perform the appraisal or review in accordance with the uniform standards of professional practice and the appraiser shall maintain the required and appropriate New Mexico certification to perform appraisal reviews."
