AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PUBLIC PEACE, HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE;
DISTRIBUTING A PERCENTAGE OF INDIAN GAMING REVENUES AND
SEVERANCE TAX PERMANENT FUND DISTRIBUTIONS FOR CRITICAL
CAPITAL OUTLAY NEEDS OF SCHOOL DISTRICTS THAT RECEIVE FEDERAL
IMPACT AID FUNDS; GIVING PRIORITY TO THE NEEDS OF PUBLIC
SCHOOLS WITH A MAJORITY OF NATIVE AMERICAN STUDENTS; PROVIDING
POWERS AND DUTIES; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Public School Capital Outlay Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] CAPITAL OUTLAY NEEDS OF SCHOOL DISTRICTS
THAT RECEIVE FEDERAL IMPACT AID FUNDS--NATIVE AMERICAN
PRIORITY--DISTRIBUTION.--

A. The council shall establish a program to provide grant assistance for public schools in school districts that receive federal impact aid funds pursuant to 20 USCA. 7701, et seq. The council shall give priority to those

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public schools that have a student membership of at least fifty percent Native Americans.

- B. The council shall approve applications for grant assistance for any public school eligible pursuant to Subsection A of this section when the council:
- (1) determines the critical capital outlay needs of the school district and public schools;
- (2) determines that the school district has used its resources in a prudent manner; and
- (3) has sought and received information and advice from representatives of Indian nations, tribes and pueblos in New Mexico regarding the critical capital outlay needs of public schools with a student membership of at least fifty percent Native Americans.
- C. The council shall allocate grants for capital outlay projects that meet the project evaluation criteria of the council pursuant to the Public School Capital Outlay Act; provided that the evaluation criteria shall not include tax effort by the school district."
- Section 2. [NEW MATERIAL] DISTRIBUTIONS--PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL OUTLAY FUND--APPROPRIATION.--
- A. The state treasurer shall transfer to the public school capital outlay fund:
- (1) an amount equal to five percent of each severance tax permanent fund distribution to the general fund; and
- (2) an amount equal to one-eighth of each distribution of revenues to the general fund from revenue-sharing agreements entered into pursuant to Laws 1997, Chapter 190.
- B. Amounts distributed to the public school capital outlay fund pursuant to Subsection A of this section . 123478. 3

shall be deposited in a separate account of the fund and are appropriated to the fund for expenditure in fiscal year 1999 and subsequent fiscal years for grants for critical capital outlay needs of public schools in school districts that receive federal impact aid funds as provided in Section 1 of this act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining in the account in the fund at the end of any fiscal year shall not revert, but shall be available for critical capital outlay needs of public schools in school districts that receive federal impact aid funds as provided in Section 1 of this act.

Section 3. DELAYED REPEAL.--Sections 1 and 2 of this act are repealed effective July 1, 2003.

Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of Section 2 of this act is July 1, 1998.
