15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. EXCELLENCE IN HIGHER EDUCATION INVESTMENT
17	FUND PURPOSE
18	A. The "excellence in higher education investment
19	fund" is created in the state treasury. All income earned on
20	the fund shall be credited to the fund. Balances in the
21	excellence in higher education investment fund are
22	appropriated to the commission on higher education for the
23	purposes of this section and shall not revert at the end of
24	any fiscal year. Disbursements from the fund shall be by
25	warrant drawn by the secretary of finance and administration

B. The commission on higher education shall administer the excellence in higher education investment fund for the purpose of enhancing the contribution of postsecondary educational institutions to the resolution of critical state issues and the advancement of the welfare of state citizens.

C. At the beginning of each fiscal year in which the commission determines that the balance of the fund is sufficient to make awards, the commission shall consult with the legislative finance committee and the governor to define or reaffirm no more than four critical issues to be addressed through awards from the fund. Issues to be addressed may include:

(1) increasing the quality of elementary and secondary education as measured by:

(a) the rate of students meeting high standards of performance;

(b) the rate of high school graduation, helping to document the importance of early childhood brain development; and

(c) the preparation of students for post-secondary education;

(2) improving the preparation of high school

graduates or college graduates for work as measured by employer satisfaction with graduates or other indices; and

(3) improving the communities' efforts in job creation.

D. The commission shall establish procedures for making awards from the fund based on evaluation of competitive proposals submitted by post-secondary educational institutions. In consultation with the governor and the legislature, the commission may establish criteria for making awards. Each winning proposal shall address at least one of the critical issues defined for use of the fund. Criteria may include:

(1) collaboration among educational agencies and other public or private entities that demonstrate a competency regarding the issues addressed by the proposal;

(2) the commitment of matching money; and

(3) evaluation components.

E. The commission shall report annually to the legislature and the governor on the status of the fund and projects supported by the fund.

Section 2. APPROPRIATION. -- One million dollars (\$1,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the excellence in higher education investment fund for expenditure in fiscal year 1999 and subsequent fiscal years for the purpose of making awards based on competitive proposals
