15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 60-6A-26.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws
17	1985, Chapter 217, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"60-6A-26.1. SMALL BREWER'S LICENSE
19	A. In any local option district, a person
20	qualified under the provisions of the Liquor Control Act,
21	except as otherwise provided in the Domestic Winery and Small
22	Brewery Act, may apply for and be issued a small brewer's
23	l i cense.
24	B. A small brewer's license authorizes the person
25	to whom it is issued to:
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1 (1) become a manufacturer or producer of 2 beer: package, label and export beer, whether 3 (2) manufactured, bottled or produced by him or any other person; 4 (3) sell only beer that is packaged by or for 5 him to a person holding a wholesaler's license or a small 6 7 brewer's license; 8 (4) deal in warehouse receipts for beer; 9 (5) conduct beer tastings and sell for 10 consumption on or off premises, but not for resale, beer produced and bottled by, or produced and packaged for, the 11 12 licensee on the small brewer's premises; 13 be deemed a manufacturer for purposes of (6) 14 the Gross Receipts and Compensating Tax Act; [ and] at public celebrations off the small 15 (7) brewer's premises, after the small brewer has paid the 16 17 applicable fee for a small brewer's public celebration permit, 18 conduct tastings and sell by the glass or in unbroken 19 packages, but not for resale, beer produced and bottled by or 20 for the small brewer: (8) at no more than two other locations off 21 the small brewer's premises, after the small brewer has paid 22 23 the applicable fee for a small brewer's off-premises permit, 24 after the director has determined that the off-premises 25 locations meet the requirements of the Liquor Control Act and . 121521. 1 - 2 -

2	after the director has issued a small brewer's off-premises
3	<u>permit for each off-premises location, conduct beer tastings</u>
4	and sell by the glass or in unbroken packages for consumption
5	off the small brewer's off-premises location, but not for

8	(9) allow members of the public, on the
9	licensed premises and under the direct supervision of the
10	licensee, to manufacture beer for personal consumption and not
11	for resale using the licensee's equipment and ingredients.
12	C. Sales and tastings of beer authorized in this
13	section shall be permitted during the hours set forth in
14	Subsection A of Section 60-7A-1 NMSA 1978 and between the
15	hours of noon and midnight on Sunday and shall conform to the
16	limitations regarding Christmas and voting-day sales found in
17	Section 60-7A-1 NMSA 1978 and the expansion of Sunday sales
18	hours to 2:00 a.m. on January 1, when December 31 falls on a
19	Sunday. "
20	Section 2. Section 60-6A-27 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1983,
21	Chapter 280, Section 8, as amended) is amended to read:
22	"60-6A-27. LICENSE FEESEvery application for the
23	issuance or annual renewal of the following licenses and
24	permits shall be accompanied by a license fee or permit fee in
25	the following specified amounts:

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1 A. brandy manufacturer's license, seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750); 2 small brewer's license, seven hundred fifty 3 B. 4 dollars (\$750); С. winer's license, seven hundred fifty dollars 5 (\$750); 6 7 D. wine blender's license, seven hundred fifty 8 dollars (\$750); E. 9 wine exporter's license, five hundred dollars 10 (\$500); winer's off-premises permit, two hundred 11 F. 12 dollars (\$200) for each off-premises location; 13 G. winer's public celebrations permit, ten dollars 14 (\$10.00) for each public celebration; [and] H. small brewer's public celebrations permit, ten 15 16 dollars (\$10.00) for each public celebration; and I. small brewer's off-premises permit, two hundred 17 18 dollars (\$200) for each off-premises location." 19 Section 3. 
