AN ACT

CREATING A JOINT INTERIM LEGISLATIVE GASOLINE PRICING STUDY COMMITTEE; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. GASOLINE PRICING STUDY COMMITTEE CREATED-TERMINATION.--The "gasoline pricing study committee" is
created as a joint interim legislative committee. The
committee shall function from the date of its appointment
until December 1 prior to the first session of the fortyfourth legislature.

Section 2. MEMBERSHIP--APPOINTMENT--VACANCIES. --

A. The gasoline pricing study committee shall be composed of eight members. Four members of the house of representatives shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, and four members of the senate shall be

appointed by the committees' committee of the senate or, if the senate appointments are made in the interim, by the president pro tempore of the senate after consultation with and agreement of a majority of the members of the committees' committee.

- B. Members shall be appointed from each house so as to give the two major political parties in each house the same proportional representation on the committee as prevails in each house; however, in no event shall either party have less than one member from each house on the committee.

 Vacancies on the committee shall be filled by appointment in the same manner as the original appointments. The chairman and vice chairman of the committee shall be elected by the committee.
- C. No action shall be taken by the committee if a majority of the total membership from either house on the committee rejects such action.

Section 3. DUTIES. -- After its appointment, the gasoline pricing study committee shall hold one organizational meeting to develop a work plan and budget for the ensuing interim. The work plan and budget shall be submitted to the New Mexico legislative council for approval. Upon approval of the work plan and budget by the legislative council, the committee shall examine the statutes, constitutional provisions, regulations, court decisions and the actions and agreements of

gasoline retailers, distributors, wholesalers and refiners concerning the pricing of gasoline in New Mexico. The committee shall report its findings and recommend legislation or changes if any are found to be necessary to the first session of the forty-fourth legislature.

Section 4. POWERS. -- The gasoline pricing study committee shall have the power to conduct hearings and administer oaths. The committee or any subcommittee thereof consisting of three members or more shall have the power to subpoena, which may be enforced through any district court of the state. Process of the committee shall be served by any sheriff or any member of the New Mexico state police and shall be served without cost to the committee.

Section 5. SUBCOMMITTEES.--Subcommittees shall be created only by majority vote of all members appointed to the gasoline pricing study committee and with the prior approval of the New Mexico legislative council. A subcommittee shall be composed of at least one member from the senate and one member from the house of representatives, and at least one member of the minority party shall be a member of the subcommittee. All meetings and expenditures of a subcommittee shall be approved by the full committee in advance of such meeting or expenditure, and the approval shall be shown in the minutes of the committee.

Section 6. REPORT.--The gasoline pricing study committee . 120634.1

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shall make a report of its findings and recommendations for the consideration of the first session of the forty-fourth legislature. The report and suggested legislation shall be made available to the New Mexico legislative council on or before December 15 preceding that session.

Section 7. STAFF.--The staff for the gasoline pricing study committee shall be provided by the legislative council service. As identified in the approved work plan and budget, the legislative council service may contract for the services of attorneys, economists and other persons knowledgeable in the field of gasoline pricing to assist the committee in its duties.

APPROPRIATION. -- For the purpose of paying the Section 8. salaries and expenses of the technical, legal, clerical and stenographic assistants, for necessary equipment and supplies used in carrying out the provisions of this act, for contractors and for reimbursing the per diem and mileage expenses of the gasoline pricing study committee, there is appropriated to the legislative council service from the general fund the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars All or any part of this appropriation may be (\$150, 000). expended in fiscal years 1998 and 1999, and any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund. Payments from the appropriation shall be made upon vouchers signed by the

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director of the legislative council service or his authorized representative.

Section 9. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
