RODRIGUEZ 4 5 6 7 FOR THE HEALTH AND WELFARE REFORM COMMITTEE 8 9 AN ACT 10 RELATING TO HEALTH CARE ACCESS; ESTABLISHING A GEOGRAPHIC 11 ACCESS DATA SYSTEM: MAKING AN APPROPRIATION. 12 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: 14 SHORT TITLE. -- This act may be cited as the Section 1. 15 "Geographic Access Data System Act." 16 Section 2. PURPOSE OF THE ACT. -- The purpose of the 17 Geographic Access Data System Act is to provide access to data 18 and information to assist the commission, the legislature and 19 other agencies and organizations in administering programs, 20

Section 3. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Geographic Access Data System Act:

planning, formulating policy and allocating resources to

improve geographic access to health services.

A. "commission" means the New Mexico health policy

7	Section 4. DATA SYSTEM - CREATION COMMISSION DUTIES					
8	A. The commission shall establish and operate the					
9	geographic access data system					
10	B. The commission shall collect data sufficient					
11	to:					
12	(1) longitudinally monitor the geographic					
13	availability of health services;					
14	(2) assess the contribution to, impact and					
15	cost-effectiveness of initiatives to improve geographic access					
16	to health care, including health professional education and					
17	training programs and initiatives to enhance access in rural					
18	and underserved areas;					
19	(3) allow for allocation of resources based					
20	on the need for various health professionals in different					
21	geographic areas;					
22	(4) enable the state to target resources and					
23	interventions to those geographic areas and health					
24	professionals most in need by the state;					
25	(5) provide information to assist in the					
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effective administration of programs to improve the supply and distribution of health professionals and services;

- (6) project future needs for health professionals and services; and
- (7) meet the information needs of the variety of public and private entities with interests in the supply and distribution of health professionals and geographic access to health services.
- C. The geographic access data system shall be available in accordance with the provisions of Section 7 of the Geographic Access Data System Act and shall provide a single point of access to data:
- (1) maintained by the state related to health service capacity and distribution;
- (2) pertaining to the supply and availability of health professionals; and
- (3) regarding state initiatives to improve geographic access.

### D. The commission shall:

- (1) utilize data already maintained in other databases and by other entities, to the extent feasible and accessible to the commission;
- (2) establish data definitions, formats and other information standards for the data maintained as part of the geographic access data system;

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- (3) make available, at least annually, a report on the geographic availability of health services and the supply and distribution of health professionals;
- (4) establish geographic access and capacity standards and methodologies to assess the relative needs of geographic service areas and for different health professionals;
- (5) assess fees for special analysis, data requests and dissemination to assist in the operation and development of the geographic access data system; and
- (6) identify and seek other sources of resources to support the geographic access data system
- E. The commission shall promulgate regulations necessary to carry out the Geographic Access Data System Act, in accordance with state law.
- F. The commission shall collect data in the most cost-effective manner.

### Section 5. ADVISORY COMMITTEE. --

- A. The commission shall establish an advisory committee representative of the data source entities using geographic access information, the health service industry and health professionals.
- B. The advisory committee shall develop recommendations on:
  - (1) data needs and sources;

- (3) data analysis, report formats and information disseminated; and
- (4) access to data maintained as part of the geographic access data system.
- C. The advisory committee shall review, no less than every three years, the need for existing data collected and maintained as part of the geographic access data system and the cost-effectiveness of maintaining the data.

### Section 6. AGENCY COOPERATION. --

A. The department of health; the human services department; the commission on higher education; the various health professional licensing boards authorized in Chapter 61 NMSA 1978; the university of New Mexico; New Mexico state university; and other state agencies in possession of data pertaining to the geographic supply and distribution of health professionals and health services, including health professional education and training programs, shall cooperate with the commission in carrying out the provisions of the Geographic Access Data System Act, including making data available, collecting survey data and participating in the geographic access data system

B. Health professional education and training programs, either directly or through the commission on higher education, shall provide data, including but not limited to

that regarding individuals trained in health professions.

- C. Health profession licensing boards shall provide the commission upon request information, including but not limited to the following:
- (1) basic data maintained as part of the licensing and relicensing procedure, including, as applicable, identification data such as name, license number, social security number, date of birth and gender; education and training institutions and locations; specialty certification; year of first licensure; type of license; status of license; and practice address; and
- (2) responses to surveys provided by the commission to be completed as part of the licensing process by the health professionals regarding the characteristics of their current and future practice.
- D. Initiatives funded or operated by the state to improve the supply of health professionals in rural and underserved areas shall provide the commission data, including but not limited to information sufficient to enable the immediate and long-term assessment of the impact of such programs, their cost-effectiveness and impact on geographic access in the state.
- E. Upon making any request for data pursuant to the Geographic Access Data System Act, the commission shall take into consideration the cost of supplying such data and

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give reasonable notice and deadlines for compliance.

#### ACCESS. - -Section 7.

- Access to data in the geographic access data system shall be provided in accordance with regulations adopted by the commission pursuant to and to fulfill the purpose of the Geographic Access Data System Act.
- В. Any data source may obtain access to data it has submitted to the geographic access data system.
  - C. Any person may obtain aggregate data.
- D. Except as provided for in this section, any data collected is strictly confidential and shall not be a matter of public record or accessible to the public.
- E. No data source shall be liable for damages to any person for having furnished information in accordance with the Geographic Access Data System Act.

APPROPRIATION. -- Seventy-five thousand dollars Section 8. (\$75,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the New Mexico health policy commission for expenditure in fiscal year 1999 to pay salaries and benefits and other costs necessary to establish and maintain the geographic access data system and administer the provisions of the Geographic Access Data System Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 1998.
