16	Section 1. TELECOMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE CREATED
17	TERMINATIONThe "telecommunications deregulation interim
18	committee" is created as a joint interim legislative
19	committee. The committee shall function from the date of its
20	appointment until December 1 prior to the first session of the
21	forty-fourth legislature.
22	Section 2. MEMBERSHIPAPPOINTMENTVACANCIES
23	A. The telecommunications deregulation interim
24	committee shall be composed of eight members. Four members of
25	the house of representatives shall be appointed by the speaker
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	. 123184. 2 - 4 -

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B. Members shall be appointed from each house so as to give the two major political parties in each house the same proportional representation on the committee as prevails in each house; however, in no event shall either party have less than one member from each house on the committee. Vacancies on the committee shall be filled by appointment in the same manner as the original appointments. The chairman and vice chairman of the committee shall be elected by the committee.

C. No action shall be taken by the committee if a majority of the total membership from either house on the committee rejects such action.

Section 3. DUTIES.--After its appointment, the telecommunications deregulation interim committee shall hold one organizational meeting to develop a work plan and budget for the ensuing interim. The work plan and budget shall be submitted to the New Mexico legislative council for approval. Upon approval of the work plan and budget by the legislative council, the committee shall examine the statutes, constitutional provisions, regulations and court decisions governing the telecommunications industry and deregulation activity in New Mexico and recommend legislation or changes if any are found to be necessary to the first session of the

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1 forty-fourth legislature.

Section 4. SUBCOMMITTEES.--Subcommittees shall be created only by majority vote of all members appointed to the telecommunications deregulation interim committee and with the prior approval of the New Mexico legislative council. A subcommittee shall be composed of at least one member from the senate and one member from the house of representatives, and at least one member of the minority party shall be a member of the subcommittee. All meetings and expenditures of a subcommittee shall be approved by the full committee in advance of such meeting or expenditure, and the approval shall be shown in the minutes of the committee.

Section 5. REPORT.--The telecommunications deregulation interim committee shall make a report of its findings and recommendations for the consideration of the first session of the forty-fourth legislature. The report and suggested legislation shall be made available to the New Mexico legislative council on or before December 15 preceding that session.

Section 6. STAFF.--The staff for the telecommunications deregulation interim committee shall be provided by the legislative council service.

Section 7. APPROPRIATION. -- For the purpose of paying the salaries and expenses of the technical, legal, clerical and stenographic assistants, including necessary expert witness testimony, for necessary equipment and supplies used in carrying . 123184.2

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1 out the provisions of this act and for reimbursing the per diem 2 and mileage expenses of the telecommunications deregulation 3 interim committee, there is appropriated to the legislative 4 council service from the general fund the sum of seventy-five 5 thousand dollars (\$75,000). All or any part of this 6 appropriation may be expended in fiscal years 1998 and 1999, and 7 any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of 8 fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund. Payments from 9 the appropriation shall be made upon vouchers signed by the 10 director of the legislative council service or his authorized 11 representative. 12 EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public Section 8.


