23	WHEREAS, too many lives are tragically damaged, if not

25	WHEREAS, drinking and driving is a problem that crosses

social, psychological, medical, political and legal institutional boundaries and each public servant touched by the problem must accept the responsibility to the best of his ability and conscientiously; and

WHEREAS, technological advances in the design of motor vehicles have resulted in equipment being manufactured that prevents an intoxicated person from starting the engine of a vehicle or operating that vehicle; and

9 WHEREAS, the steering column interlock system is one of
10 those technologies that seems to work under certain
11 circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the judiciary plays a critical role in the administration of justice relative to DWI penalties;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the administrative office of the courts be requested to work with municipal, magistrate and district judges to use the steering column interlock system in sentencing of DWI offenders and to prevent multiple-DWI offenders from driving under the influence and placing citizens at risk; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the director of the administrative office of the courts and to the chief justice of the supreme court.
