A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THAT THE HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE NEW MEXICO HEALTH POLICY COMMISSION, DEVELOP A METHOD TO TRACK THE DISPOSITION OF WELFARE CLIENTS WHO LOSE WELFARE BENEFITS WITH REGARD TO HEALTH INSURANCE AND THE IMPACT OF THE UNINSURED ON INDIGENT FUNDS AND CHARITY CARE.

WHEREAS, it is a stated goal of welfare reform to reduce dependency on temporary assistance funds and find jobs for recipients; and

WHEREAS, recipients of welfare benefits also receive medicaid benefits; and

WHEREAS, most recipients who find jobs and lose welfare benefits also lose access to medicaid coverage; and

WHEREAS, an estimated thirty-seven percent of all New
Mexicans have no health insurance and nearly eighty percent of

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the uninsured are employed; and

WHEREAS, statistics indicate that forty-nine percent of businesses in New Mexico do not offer health insurance benefits to their employees; and

WHEREAS, any increase in the number of uninsured people will place a burden on the health care delivery system by increasing use of indigent funds and the provision of charity care and other unintended results;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the human services department be requested to establish a task force in conjunction with the New Mexico health policy commission, the New Mexico hospital and health systems association and the New Mexico association of counties to develop a method to track recipients who lose welfare benefits in order to determine whether these individuals obtain health insurance benefits in their new jobs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an analysis be performed to determine the potential impact that the reduction in welfare recipients can have on the number of uninsured people in the state, on the use of indigent funds and on the provision of charity care; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the human services department and the New Mexico health policy commission present a report to the appropriate interim legislative committee by September

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1, 1998; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be sent to the secretary of human services, the chairman of the New Mexico health policy commission, the executive director of the New Mexico association of counties and the president of the New Mexico hospital and health systems association.
