## HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL 39

## A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION, THE CHILDREN, YOUTH AND FAMILIES DEPARTMENT AND THE HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO SUPPORT ARRI BACARE.

WHEREAS, the rate of uninsured persons in the county of Rio Arriba is estimated to be as high as fifty percent; and

WHEREAS, the transition to medicaid managed care creates a further strain on Rio Arriba's rural clinics, possibly removing money which has subsidized health care for the uninsured working poor; and

WHEREAS, the confluence of these factors threatens to cause the collapse of Rio Arriba's only existing primary care infrastructure in rural areas; and

WHEREAS, lack of access to services due to lack of health . 122085. 1

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insurance increases hospital debt and costs by encouraging inappropriate use of the emergency room and by inhibiting the timely diagnosis and management of preventable conditions such as diabetes; and

WHEREAS, the estimated demand for primary care encounters in January of 1996 in Rio Arriba county was ninety-eight thousand eight hundred eighty-nine compared to an actual supply of encounters of ninety thousand six hundred, necessitating the addition of an extra six physicians to meet the demand; since many private physicians do not accept medicaid, creation of a private insurance for the medically indigent would boost the supply of available encounters to meet the demand; and

WHEREAS, the incidence of deaths of men and women in Rio Arriba county attributed to homicide leads the state at over three times the statewide rate, and much of the violence is a symptom of pandemic substance abuse, and Rio Arriba ranks third among New Mexico counties in deaths of men from alcohol-related accidents and fourth in suicide; and

WHEREAS, the plan for ArribaCare calls for the integration of substance abuse treatment by training physicians to do early risk assessment, by assigning treatment patients a primary care provider and by increasing communication between treatment facilities and primary care providers and financing appropriate treatment through

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insurance coverage; and

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WHEREAS, the ArribaCare might address and potentially solve many issues of managed care in Rio Arriba county and serve as a model for the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the department of health, the children, youth and families department, the human services department and the department of finance and administration be requested to evaluate ArribaCare as a pilot for a model statewide, and support the county of Rio Arriba with technical and financial support; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the secretaries of health; children, youth and families; human services; and finance and administration.

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
